Explore the differences between communication, consultation, and engagement, and when each is most appropriate to use.

Learn about a new method of communication that helps condition the public and prepare them for change.

# PLANNING & ACTION

Strategic Planning is an art. Compare good (and bad) vision statements, and how they lead to good and bad strategic plans. Work through the real questions that need to be asked in order to produce a useful, action-oriented strategic plan.

# MUNICIPAL COLLABORATION

There is growing pressure, not only in Alberta, but across the country, to improve municipal collaboration, both within municipalities, and also between them. What are the external and internal challenges to building stronger communities, and what are the effective strategies for cooperation?

### CHANGE MANAGEMENT

The world is changing dramatically, yet many communities are planning as if the world will remain very much the same. Learn how to effectively navigate change for a viable and strong community into the future.


