# Do I need a Study Permit?

Yes! You must apply for a study permit before coming to Canada.

- **Letter of acceptance** from the [designated learning institution](#) in Canada
- You can apply for the study permit by paper at a [Visa Application Centre](#) or online.

*Note: Our focus in this session will be on the online application process.*

# Do I need a representative to help me apply?

No.

Client submits their application and pays their application and biometrics fees.

This can be completed online, by mail, or in-person at a VAC.

Client receives the Biometric Instruction Letter (BIL).

If the client is applying in-person, the application and biometrics collection can be completed at the same time at a VAC.

Officer conducts an assessment (including eligibility and admissibility) of the application including all documentation provided and biometric results.

Officer informs the applicant of the final decision.

If APPROVED, client will receive visa and can travel to Canada for the intended purpose.

If refused, client is informed and biometrics are still valid for up to 10 years.

At Port of Entry, client may be subjected to systematic or discretionary biometric verification.

Permit is issued.

**Client is able to enter Canada**

# What are the main supporting documents required?

- Passport
- Letter of Acceptance from the University of Alberta
- Proof of means of financial support
- Passport digital photo

# What are the main supporting documents required?

- E-Medical Form: if Immigration Medical Exam (IME) is required
- Family Information Form
- Police Clearance maybe required depending on from where and how you apply

## Create an account or sign in

With your account, you can apply, pay your fees and check your status for [some applications](#).

- a Government of Canada login (**GCKey**)

What's the difference?

- **Sign-in Partner** (SecureKey Concierge) uses your online banking information
- **GCKey** is the Government of Canada credential

# Find out if you need a medical exam

If you are applying to become a temporary resident of Canada, you must have a medical exam if you:

- want to come to Canada for more than six months, and
- have lived or travelled for six months in certain countries or territories in the year before you come to Canada.

You need a medical exam if there is a “**yes**” in the **second** column. Countries are listed alphabetically. Certain overseas locations may also be listed under the country of sovereignty, such as the United Kingdom.

# Proof of Sufficient Funds

- Funds need to cover at least one year of living expenses and tuition fees
- One year's living expenses is estimated at \$10 000 for one person (at least \$2000 additional to cover travel)
- More funds will be needed if you will be accompanied by your dependent family members
- An additional \$4000 for spouse and \$3000 for each accompanying child



# Proof of Means of Financial Support Documents

- Bank statements for the past 4 months
- Letter of undertaking from parent or sponsor in addition to their bank statements, employment documents, proof of relationship, etc.
- Official letter of scholarships and awards



# Proof of Means of Financial Support Documents

- Tuition payment receipts (recommended)
- Investments and/or stocks and bonds (if applicable)
- Income from rental properties (if applicable)
- If applicable, include documents confirming campus residence and a copy of the \$500 receipt of your residence deposit

# How can I make my application stronger?

## 1. Financial Ability:

- Include as many documents as possible
- Clearly itemize documents provided in a cover letter\*
- All documents are either in English or French
- Pay your university tuition fees upfront and include the receipt with your application (recommended)...*in the event your SP application is refused you can contact the University for a refund*



# Cover Letter Example

Dear Consular Officer:

Please find the enclosed supporting financial documents. The documents are attached in the following order:

- Parent's letter of support: page 1
- Parent's bank statements: page 3
- Parent's employment letter: page 10
- Scholarship award letter: page 11
- Tuition fee payment receipt: page 12





# How can I make my application stronger?

## 2. Study Plan:

Provide a letter of explanation which includes a clear and concise study plan and upload under “Optional Documents”



# Study Plan Details

- Why you wish to study in Canada in this particular program
- What is your overall educational goal
- Why you are not pursuing a similar program in home country
- What research have you done into studies in home country
- How this program enhances your employment opportunities in home country
- Details of education history including all relevant transcripts if applicable
- What ties you have to home country including supporting documents when possible

# How can I make my application stronger?

## 3. Application Process:

- Carefully read the [Instruction Guide](#) and follow instructions
- Pay attention to detail when completing and preparing application documents
- Make sure all application forms are typed (not hand-written)
- Validate the IMM1294 form before uploading (signature not required when applying online)



# How can I make my application stronger?

- Double check your application and all supporting documents before submission
- Check [processing times](#) and apply as soon as you receive admission letter
- Contact the International Advisors at: [advising@ualberta.ca](mailto:advising@ualberta.ca) for assistance



# What happens after you submit your SP application?

- You can expect to receive a “Biometrics Instruction Letter” (BIL) if you have never provided your biometrics in the past 10 years
- Check your account regularly for updates or requests for additional documents



# What can cause a delay in the processing of my application?

- Medical and security screening may take longer than usual
- If you get asked for an interview
- You apply by paper and communicate with Immigration Canada by mail instead of your online account
- You don't respond quickly to follow up requests
- High number of applications being processed during same period of time



# What happens after your SP has been approved?

- Check your GCKey account regularly
- If approved, you will receive a “Letter of Introduction”
- Letter of Introduction must be presented to Immigration Border Officer in order to receive your study permit
- Check study permit for accuracy regarding your personal information
- When entering Canada, carry with you copies of all documents used in your application
