The wahkohtowin Lodge is a meeting and gathering space for our Augustana community.



# A FRESH WAY **TO FOCUS**

Augustana's 3 + 11 calendar equals major benefits for students. This format eases you into university life, giving you more flexibility to be social and make friends before diving into a full course load. It's all about prioritizing community, something we care deeply about here.

### How does it work?

Each term begins with a three-week block, when you focus on a single course. This format allows for activities that do not easily fit within a traditional semester structure - like experiential learning opportunities abroad, outdoors or in the surrounding community. Following that is an 11-week block in which you will take the rest of that semester's courses in a more typical structure. The best part? You're still completing the same number of courses in the same amount of time, but with much more flexibility and free time!

As part of my program I completed a 19 day study abroad course in Costa Rica to collect data on tropical ecosystems. More specifically, I studied how to prevent an imbalance of male and female sea turtles due to temperature differences during the hatching period. But my favourite part was helping researchers release baby sea turtles into the ocean. I think an important part of university is to try different directions to see what interests you, and Augustana allows for that opportunity to experiment and explore."

# **SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS**

The University of Alberta awards more than \$46 million each year in undergraduate scholarships, awards and financial support. View all entrance awards at uab.ca/awards

### **Admission-Based**

Receive a scholarship you don't even have to apply for! Eligibility for these scholarships is based on your admission average at the time of your admission offer. We advise you to apply to your program early so we can assess you for a match to the following awards and many more:

### **Gold Standard Scholarship**

The top 5% of students in each faculty could receive up to \$6,000, depending on admission average.

### **Indigenous Entrance Scholarship**

First Nations, Métis or Inuit applicants with an average of 80%+ may receive \$1,500.

### **National Achievement Scholarship**

The Top Canadian students from out-of-province will receive \$30,000, payable over four years.

### **Application-Based**

Applying for awards is easy. Just fill out a single application and we will match you to a potential scholarship or award based on your background, experiences, academics and interests. The deadline for application-based awards is January 10, 2024, and you must apply to your program first.

### **President's Centenary Entrance Citation**

High-achievers engaged with their community and showing top admission averages receive up to \$50,000.

### **Entrance Leadership Scholarship**

Well-rounded leaders with demonstrated contributions to their community may receive up to \$5,000.

### **Augustana Community Endowment Fund**

Awarded to a student with satisfactory academic standing enrolled in an undergraduate degree program at Augustana.
