

- You can apply as early as October 1 of the year prior to when you'd like to be admitted.

- April 30 is the deadline to guarantee a spot in upper-year student housing.
- Apply online at uab.ca/residence

AFTER YOU APPLY

After you apply for admission you will receive a unique student number and a Campus Computing ID (CCID) which can be used to apply for scholarships and awards.

APPLY FOR SCHOLARSHIPS uab.ca/awards

 Applications open February 1, 2025 and close March 31, 2025.

NOTE: You must submit an application for admission before submitting an application for scholarships and awards.

UNDERSTAND EVALUATION

- Transfer students are anyone who has attended an accredited postsecondary institution.
- Students with less than 24 units of transferable post-secondary coursework will be evaluated on high school admission requirements and performance in high school and post-secondary coursework could be considered. Learn more at uab.ca/calendar
- Students with 24 units or more of transferable post-secondary coursework will be evaluated on high school admission requirements and performance in post-secondary coursework. Refer to Admission Requirements on pages 26-31.
- Competitive Grade Point Averages (GPAs) are typically calculated using the most recent 24 units of coursework available.
- Some programs may require specific Grade 12 prerequisites, which can potentially be substituted by post-secondary courses.

NOTE: Some programs may have additional requirements for admission such as the Casper test or Spoken English Proficiency. Refer to Admission Requirements on pages 26-31.

NOTE: 24 units is typically equivalent to 8 halfvear courses and will refer to the number of units transferable to the University of Alberta, not the number of units from the issuing institution.

TAKE NOTE

ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY

You must possess the required level of English Language Proficiency (ELP) to be granted admission. There are several ways to do so. uab.ca/languageregs

Excludes programs that require French Language Proficiency (FLP).

TRANSCRIPTS

All your post-secondary transcripts, and applicable high school transcripts, must be received by the university by June 15, 2025, uab.ca/appdocs

STUDY PERMIT

Once admitted to the U of A, make any necessary changes to your study permit through the IRCC. uab.ca/permit

TRANSFERRING WITHIN ALBERTA

If you are transferring from another post-secondary institution in Alberta, you can use the Transfer Alberta website to view which of the courses you have taken (or are planning to take) are transferable to the University of Alberta. transferalberta.alberta.ca

If you have studied high school and/or postsecondary in Alberta, those transcripts will be received automatically through ApplyAlberta, as long as you have provided authorization on your application for admission and there are no holds on the account at your previous institution that would prevent us from receiving your transcript.

CHECK YOUR STATUS

- After applying, you will have access to Launchpad. Here you can check your application status, submit outstanding documents and review any checklist items for your program.



At the University of Alberta we offer two types of awards: admission-based and application-based. Admission-Based

Eligibility for these scholarships are based on your Admission Grade Point Average (AGPA) at the time of your admission offer, so you can receive a scholarship you don't even have to apply for. Students who display outstanding academic achievement could receive up to \$2,500.

We use a single application form to match you to scholarships and awards based on your background, experiences, academics and interests. Examples include:
