The **China Institute** released a report about China's energy sector and how Alberta could diversify its energy exports to China on January 23. The study, commissioned by Alberta Energy of the **Government of Alberta**, takes a detailed look at China's petroleum needs, how it manages energy imports

and its energy capacities. The report also examines Alberta's options in pursuing energy interests in China in concert with the federal government and energy decision-makers in Asia. 

Napoleoni spoke about some of the key findings of her book. Maonomics charts the prodigious ascent of the Chinese economic miracle and the parallel decay of Western economies.


On June 10, the Edmonton Chinese Bilingual Education Association held its



September 19-21, 2012 the China Institute, in collaboration with Foreign



Affairs and International Trade Canada and the International Development Research Centre held the China and Canada in Africa: Interests, Strategies and African Perspectives conference in Ottawa. The conference brought together academics, government officials, and business people

from China, Africa, Europe, the U.S. and Canada to discuss Chinese and Canadian involvement in Africa and its policy implications. The high level forum was full to capacity with over 85 invited participants that include a number of Ambassadors and High Commissioners from Africa. Among the many speakers was **Ambassador Zhong Jianhua**, Special Representative for African Affairs from the Chinese Ministry of Foreign Affairs who delivered the keynote address.



China Related Activities

On October 24, 2012, the China Institute released its second **Annual Survey**



report Albertans' Views on China. This report examines the data from a 10-question survey probing Albertans' opinions about China and its significance to the province economically. The results indicate Albertans generally hold positive attitudes toward China and the importance of economic ties between Alberta and China, although there appears to have been a decline in support for Chinese investment in this province. However, the survey found continued strong support for trade with China and the promotion of energy exports to
