Over the course of two years, in part-time study, you will develop educational research skills and learn to apply them in your educational context.

To optimize the learning experience, students in this cohort will be taught primarily by Indigenous faculty, focusing on Indigenous pedagogies and research methodologies.

THE PROGRAM

The MES is structured to facilitate studying while you work. You will complete ten courses, in sequence, with a cohort of Indigenous teachers and school leaders (limited to 24 students). Four of the courses are delivered in-person in Maskwacîs during the summer; the remaining six are delivered online, with both synchronous and asynchronous components.
