Thesis Registration (Ongoing)

Full-time students in thesis-based programs must register in each term (Fall, Winter, Spring and Summer).

Fall/Winter Terms

- To be considered full-time, students must be registered in a minimum of 9 credits
 - This will be comprised of coursework and/or thesis registration:
 - 9 credits of coursework + no thesis registration
 - 6 credits of coursework + THES 903 (\star 3)
 - 3 credits of coursework + THES 906 $(\bigstar 6)$
 - 0 credits of coursework + THES 909 (\bigstar 9)

Spring/Summer Terms

- To be considered full-time, students must be registered in a minimum of 6 credits
- FGSR will automatically add registration in THES 906 (\star 6) to each thesis-based student's BearTracks account
- Courses taken in Spring/Summer, are assessed at an **additional** cost
