Working in Canada

International Students studying <u>FULL TIME</u> have the option to work on and off campus

 Post Grad Work Permits (PGWP) can be obtained after you have completed your program and receive a completion letter from FGPS or your Faculty.

 Spouses and Common-law partners of a Study Permit holder may be eligible to obtain Open Work Permits

International Student and Visitor Services

Post Graduation Work Permit (PGWP)

- Maintaining continuous full-time enrollment*
- Permit length (3 year PGWP*)
- Apply for the work permit as soon as you have completed your degree program
- PGWP is an open work permit (a job offer from a Canadian employer is not required)

Work authorization (Off-campus and On -campus work)

Thesis vs. Course based students

- Thesis based students are enrolled in every term which means they can only work max of 20 hrs per week off campus (year round).
- Course based students can work full-time (off-campus) in spring and summer terms if they are full-time enrolled in the terms prior and after the spring/summer break.
- Students can work any number of hours on campus as long as they maintain FT enrollment
