Responsibility	Provost and Vice-President (Academic)
The Purpose of the Proposal is (please be specific)	To introduce a course designator NORSE for the Old Norse language courses taught currently as SCAND 551 and 552. This change will identify the course as a language course rather than a lecture course in English translation in Scandinavian Studies (as the SCAND designator indicates) and provide a direct identification between the course content and the course designator. In this way, it will be consistent with the other language courses in Scandinavian Studies, which have their own course designators (NORW, SWED, and DANSK).
The Impact of the Proposal is	This change will make the fact that we do offer an Old Norse class more obvious to students looking for Language Other than English classes. Logically, there is no reason for students interested in taking an Old Norse language course to look under SCAND, since courses under this designator are otherwise all literature or content-based and are taught in English translation.

The Department publicizes all of its courses on its website and will continue to do so with the new prefix. The courses with the new prefix will be advertised in the Arts Newsletter and promoted at open houses, on social media, and within existing courses. The Faculty of Arts recruitment team will work with the Office of the Registrar to update information for prospective students.
Supplementary Notes and context	This new prefix aligns with practice for Language other than English classes offered by non-language-specific departments (e.g. PORT, NORW, and SWED in Modern Languages and Cultural Studies and LATIN and GREEK in History and Classics).

Justification:

At present, the Scandinavian program offers courses in the Old Norse language only at the 500-level, which (understandably) limits enrollment of undergraduate students interested in taking such a course. Moreover, the proposed new courses would fulfill the LOE

requirement, unlike the current SCAND 551/552 courses. We are proposing therefore to remove the graduate-level SCAND 551/552 and replace them with NORSE 111/112. Both offering the course at an introductory level and signaling it as a language course will help to boost enrolment and will provide students interested in approaching Scandinavian Studies from a medieval angle with a logical (and useful) language option. At present, our courses with medieval content have by far the most robust enrollment in our program, and we hope that by changing the graduate-level grammar-focused SCAND 551/552 to NORSE 111/112 we can further grow this area.

We also wish to change the title of the courses to make them more appealing and better reflect the content. The new courses do not focus only on grammar and historical linguistics, but rather give a general introduction to the language of medieval Iceland and Norway, including (but not limited to) its grammar.

The Purpose of the Proposal is (please be specific)	To approve an official parchment for Freestanding Certificates for use by all Faculties; this will provide a consistent document across the university. The official parchment will contain the signatures of the Dean and the University Registrar.
The Impact of the Proposal is	In the past, Faculties have issued their own parchments for Freestanding Certificates. Approving an official parchment for Freestanding Certificates will allow for consistency in the design of these certificates and to protect the integrity and ceremonial importance of a University of Alberta parchment. Including the signatures of the Dean as well as the University Registrar on this proposed parchment reflects alignment with the UAPPOL Parchment Procedure and distinguishes it from the official institutional parchment of a degree program, which includes signatures of the Chancellor, President, Chair of the Board, and Registrar. The proposed parchment aligns freestanding certificate parchments with all other university certificate parchments which include the signatures of the Dean and Registrar only.

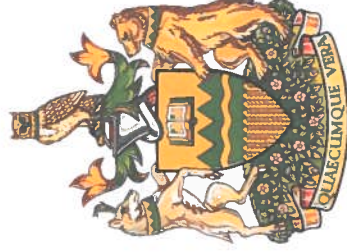
