## Support Staff Working After Retirement

## For employees who retire from the University of Alberta and are eligible to receive a pension from PSPP

- Service: When an employee retires, service is broken whether the employee goes on pension immediately, defers pension to a later date, or resumes work at the University, even if commencement is the first work day following retirement.
- An employee who has retired and is eligible for or in receipt of a pension from the PSPP may work at the University.
- Appointments are made according to the Collective Agreement. Benefit eligibility is as follows:

- If the returning employee is collecting pension, they cannot ever again contribute to PSPP.
- If the returning employee has previously received a retirement bonus, they are ineligible to receive an additional retirement bonus.
