A fair and objective way for:

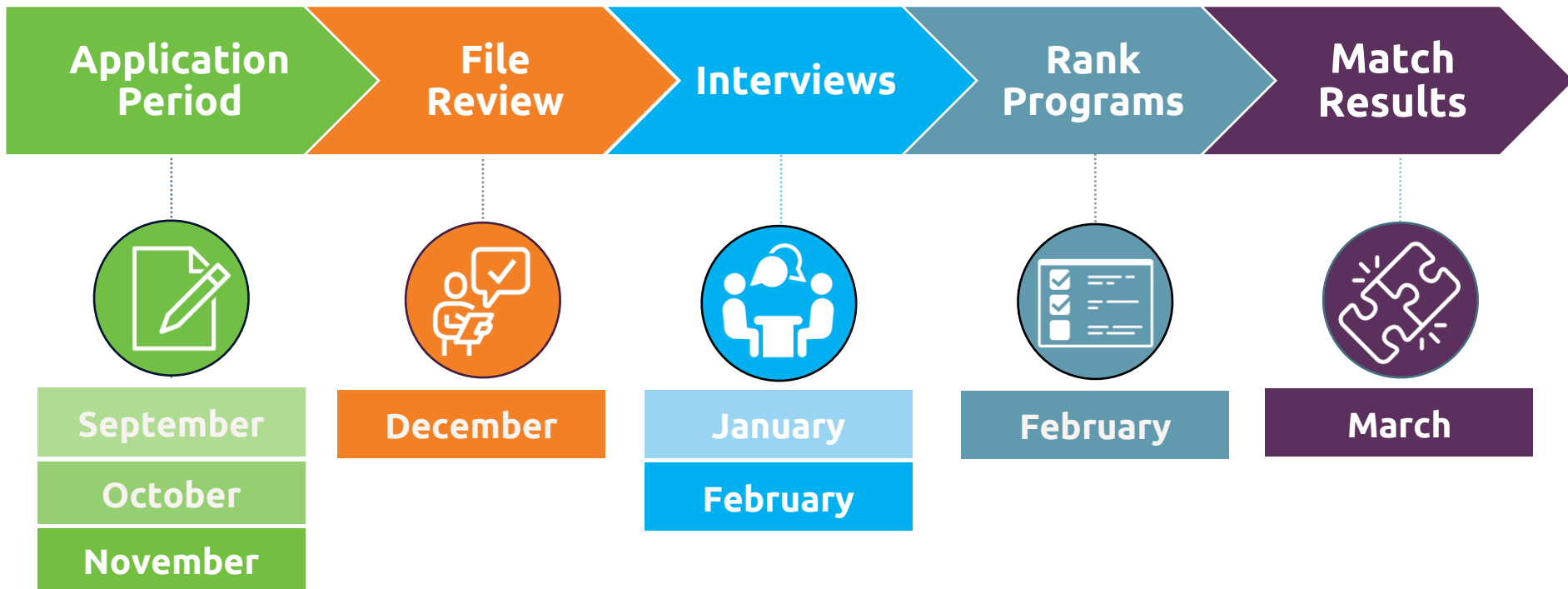
- Applicants to decide where they wish to apply for training
- Programs to decide whom they wish to interview and train

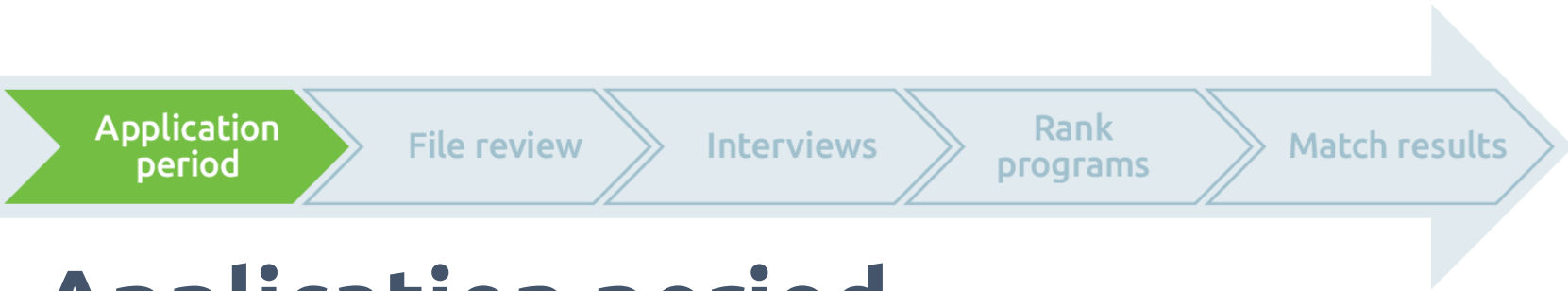
Match outcomes are determined using:

- Rank order lists from applicants and programs
- Quota (number of positions) assigned to programs
- Algorithm



Phases of the Match Cycle



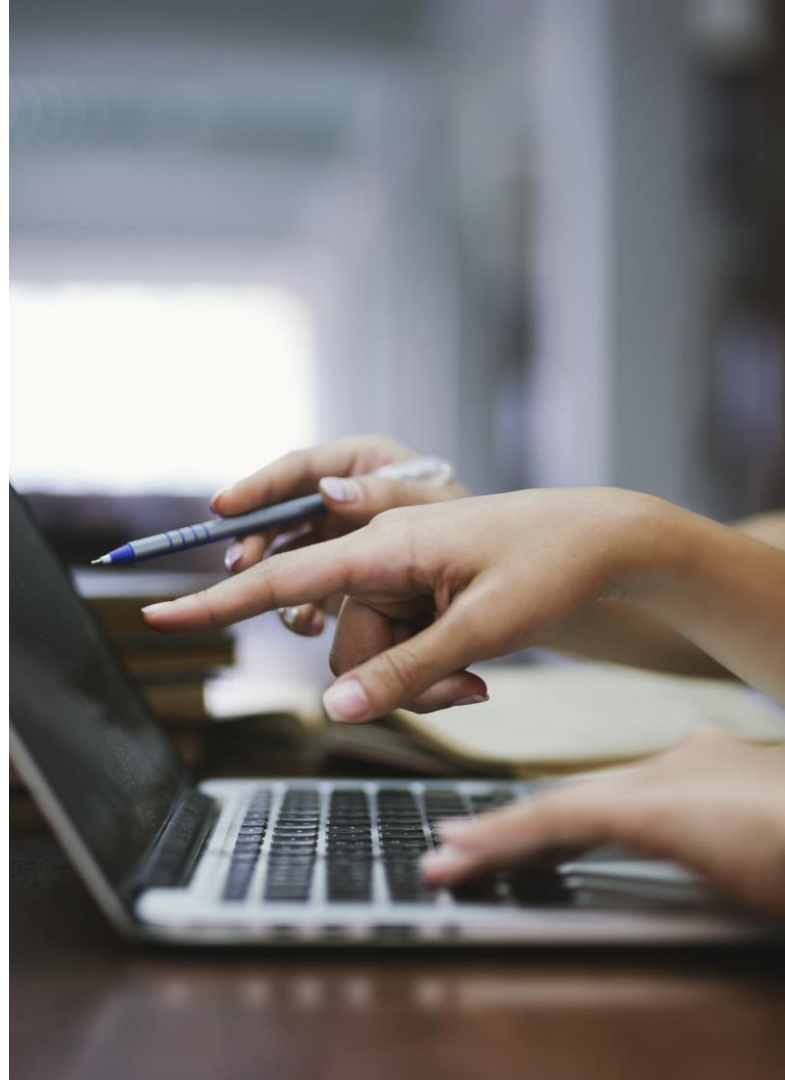

Before applying to a program read the description and make sure you are eligible and that it's the right fit for you.

Getting started with CaRMS Online

- ✓ Access information is distributed to you by email on September 20 after 12:00 (noon) ET.
- ✓ Complete your registration to activate your account
- ✓ Review your applicant contract and data sharing options
- ✓ Participate in the R-1 match



Your CaRMS contract

- Outlines your **obligations**, as well as those of CaRMS, and faculties throughout the match process
- A match is a **binding** contract between you and programs
- You are responsible for the completeness and accuracy of the information provided to CaRMS and programs
- You are expected to conduct yourself in an ethical and professionally responsible manner



Client code of conduct

- The Match is a high-stakes process, but the pressures associated with the application process are not an excuse for inappropriate interactions with CaRMS staff.
- CaRMS has developed a client [Code of Conduct](#) that any hostile, threatening, or intimidating interactions with any of the CaRMS team will not be tolerated.
- Any proposed sanctions will not impact the applicant's ability to participate in a Match but will be designed to restrict the ability to access the CaRMS Help team for guidance on process or product usage.

Match Violations Policy

- Protects your right to a fair and safe match experience by requiring everyone involved to behave professionally, ethically and responsibly
- Provides **clear examples** of actions that could constitute violations
- **Sanctions based on severity of violations**—ranging from a remedial caution to a multi-year ban from the match
- Reporting a suspected violation will not affect your application or match status
- Report suspected violations to compliance@carms.ca

Medical Identification Number for Canada (MINC)

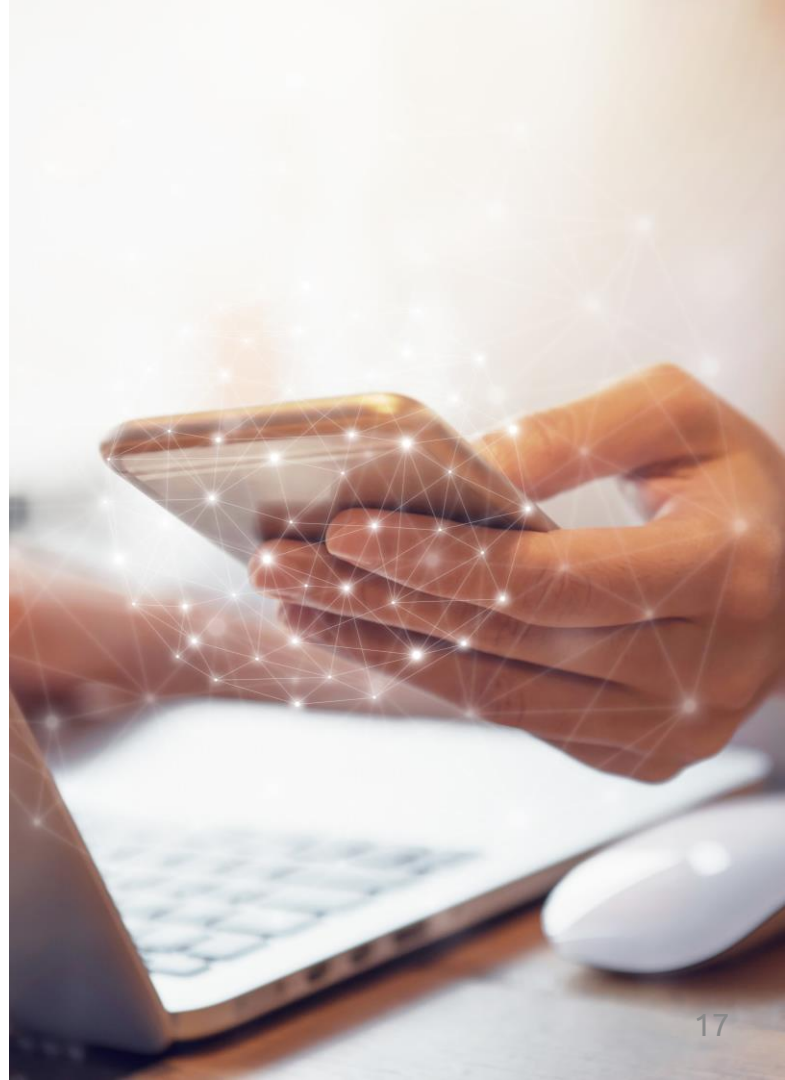
- The MINC is a unique identifier for all individuals who enter the Canadian medical education system.
- Required to participate in the match

Ways to obtain a MINC:

- 1) Reach out to your Undergraduate office
- 2) Contact the Medical Council of Canada (MCC) and register for your MCCQE1 examination

Data sharing agreements

- CaRMS shares data with organizations outside of the application and matching process
- You are able to review the consent module within CaRMS Online and control what you choose to share
- Choosing to not share your data has no impact on your application or match process

Transcript and MSPR

- You have the ability to upload the Transcript yourself within your CaRMS Online account
- The MSPR must be submitted to CaRMS by your undergraduate office
- Follow the local policies of your faculty regarding document submission to CaRMS



Proof of citizenship

Option 1 (takes approx. 3 weeks)

Register for the Medical Council of Canada Qualifying Examination Part 1 (MCCQE1).

- Upon registration, send your legal status documents to the MCC by **October 20th** for verification.
- Once verified, you'll be granted an Identity Validity Period (IVP) which is valid for 5 years.
- You can transfer your verified legal status and IVP from the MCC directly in your CaRMS Online account for use in the match.

Option 2

Upload a **notarized** or **certified** proof of citizenship/legal status document in your CaRMS Online account.

- Acceptable documents vary by province
- Refer to provincial criteria and program descriptions for guidance

Personal letter

- Created in CaRMS Online
 - My Documents > Personal letters
- Required by each program
- Requested content varies by program
- This is a time-consuming task
- Suggestion: have your final letter(s) reviewed by a third party

- 2 MB size limit and JPG format only.

Reference Documents

Things to consider

- Determine your reference needs
 - Which discipline(s) or programs will you apply to
- Reference requirements vary by program
- Requirements will be confirmed within program descriptions on September 20th
- Back up references in case referee is unable to submit on time



Reference Documents – Cont.

An **early reference document form** is available on carms.ca

- Used to make a request **prior** to the system opening on September 20th
- Should only be used if you want traditional letters of reference
- Cannot use towards programs that require:
 - AFMC-approved Structured Reference Letters (Family Medicine, Emergency Medicine, Orthopedic Surgery)
 - Formulaire d'appui (Quebec universities)
 - Other program specific reference forms

Reference Documents – Cont.

How to request references in CaRMS Online

1. Create a reference request in your CaRMS Online account
 - My Documents > Reference Requests
 - Select the type of reference you need (discipline, language, referee details)
2. Once finalized, send the request to your referee
3. Referees are asked to submit their references in CaRMS Online by November 30th
4. Review the status of your reference document in the **Document Tracking** section of CaRMS Online

CASPer test

- The CASPer test may be required by some provinces and/or programs. You must review provincial criteria and program descriptions
- Sessions offered can be found on the *Acuity Insights* website and have **limited** seating
- Information regarding the dates to write the test and status updates regarding your result will be emailed to you during the application period
- Complete the Casper test in the language of the program to which you are applying
- *Acuity Insights* will request **consent to share** your result with CaRMS
- **CaRMS will receive the result and add it into your CaRMS Online account**
- Results are only valid for **the current match cycle**

Family Medicine Professional Choices Assessment (FM-ProC)

- FM-ProC is a situational judgment that is specifically create for Family Medicine
- **Information regarding registration will be available within the participating Family Medicine program descriptions**
- You can complete the assessment in the language you are most comfortable in (French of English).
- CaRMS will receive the score and add it into your CaRMS Online account

Other potential requested documents

- Language exams
 - Test de français international (TFI)
 - TOEFL and/or IELTS
- Custom resumé (CV)
- Undergraduate and Graduate transcript(s)



Translation services for bilingual applicants

- We facilitate third-party translations for **MSPR's** and **Reference Documents**
- Transcripts do not need to be translated
- Before you can request translations:
 - Your account must be set as bilingual (both French and English)
 - The original language document must already be in your account
- CaRMS' translation service is not mandatory – other third-party translations are accepted
- Centralized translation request and receipt within CaRMS Online

Translation requests

- Translations are guaranteed if requested by the translation request deadline
- Students will be able to review the translated MSPR prior to the application deadline
- Reference documents are confidential and cannot be viewed
- The original (pre-translated) reference document is combined with the translated once returned to CaRMS

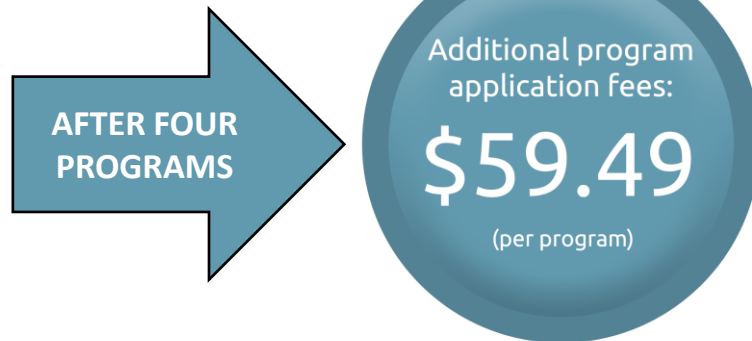

Application to programs

- Opens on November 1, 2023 at 12:00 (noon) ET
- You apply to a University + Discipline + Location (UBC + Family Medicine + Vancouver)
- You are charged a program application fee for each university + discipline only (i.e. one charge for NOSM Family Medicine, regardless of number of sites)
- Three-step process:
 - ✓ Select the program(s)
 - ✓ Assign requested documents
 - ✓ Submit your application(s)

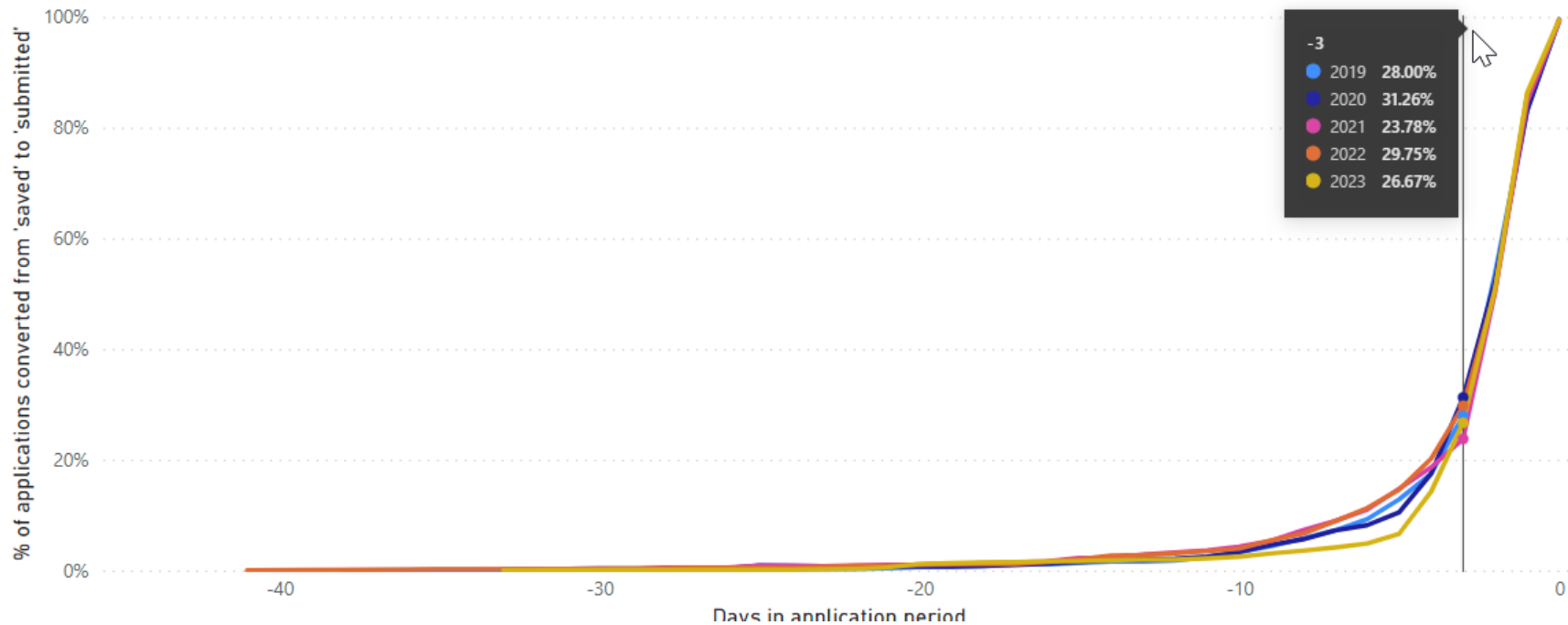

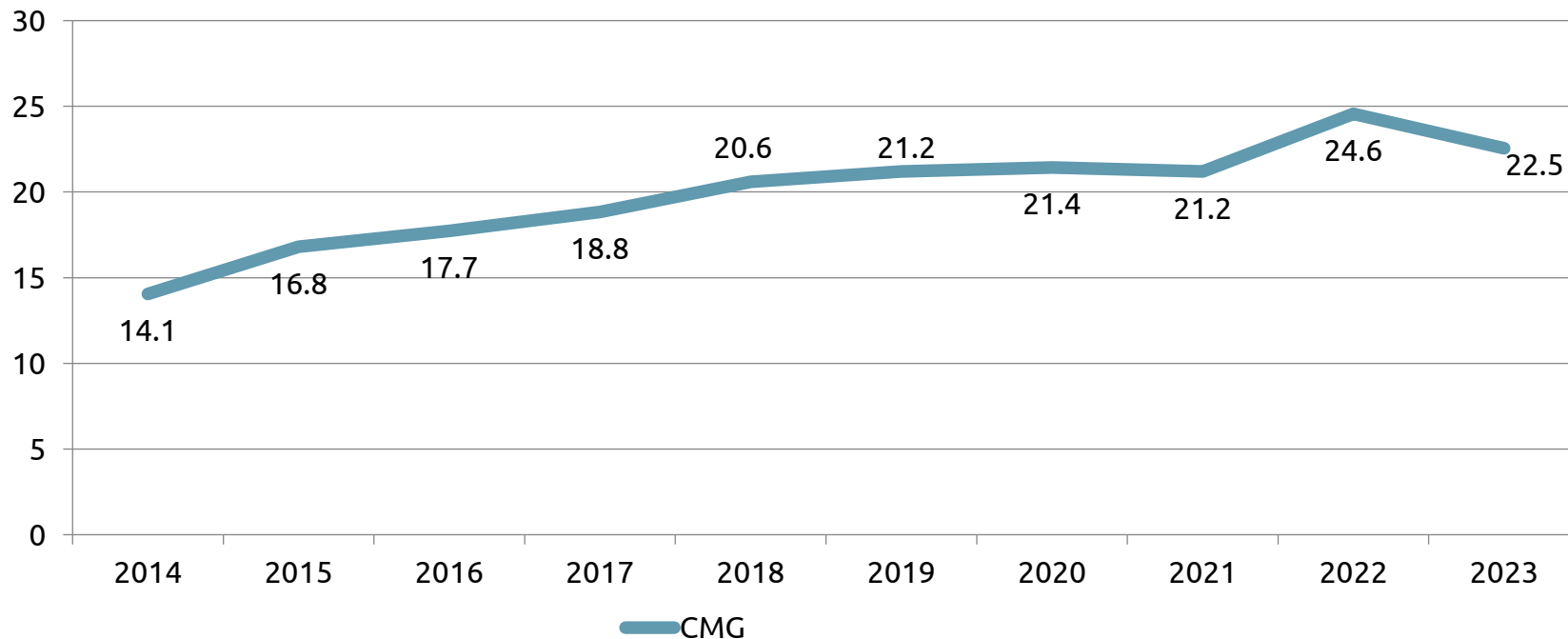


Application behavior leading up to submission deadline

Average number of CMG program applications



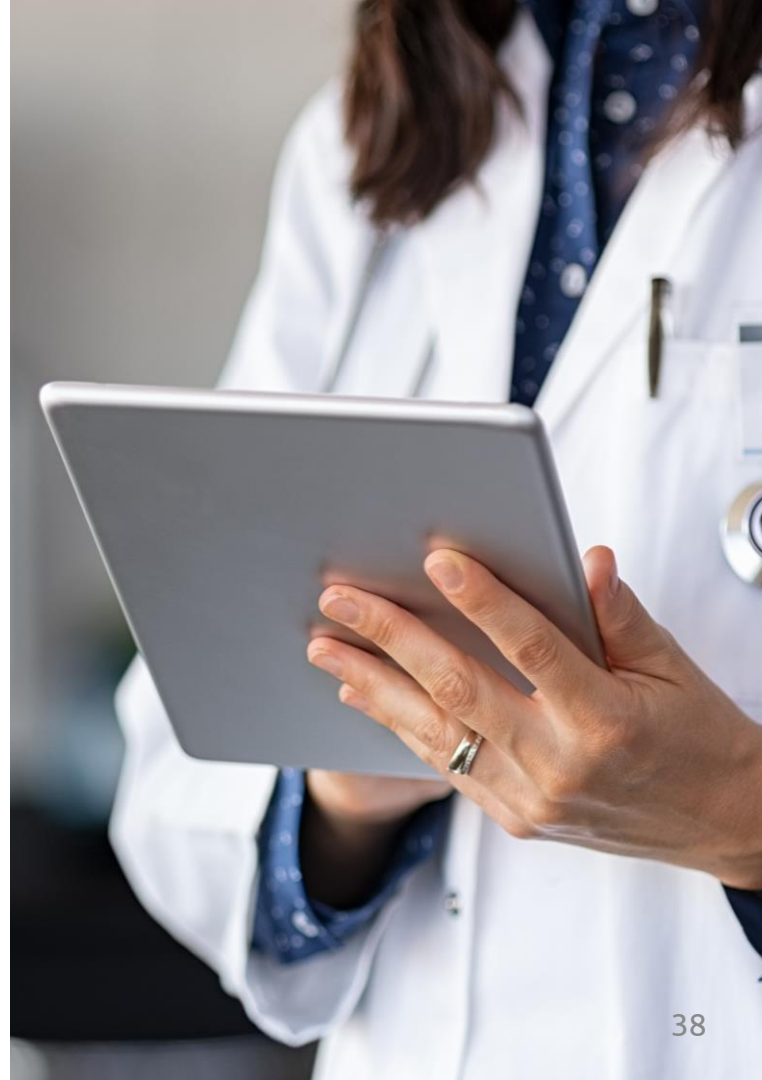


File review

File Review period

December 1, 2023 – January 15, 2024

- ✓ Review program descriptions for interview details
- ✓ Practice your interview skills
- ✓ Review the **Interview Offer Status** section within your CaRMS Online account



What are programs looking for in my application?

Programs must enter the following information within their program descriptions:

- **Program goals**

- **Example:** Residents in our program acquire the necessary skills to prepare them for practice in any setting, and in particular - northern and rural communities.

- **Selection process goals**

- **Example:** Applicants who possess attributes of prioritizing their own personal well-being and work-life balance.

What are programs looking for in my application?

- **Components that are evaluated during the file review and interview processes**
 - **Example:** Extra-curricular activities as it demonstrates if the applicant prioritizes personal interests and work-life balance.
- **Specify if they evaluate information gathered outside of the CaRMS application**
 - **Example:** We search applicants on social media
- **Indicate any potential reasons they would not rank an applicant**
 - **Example:** Unprofessional or inappropriate behavior during interviews or the match process

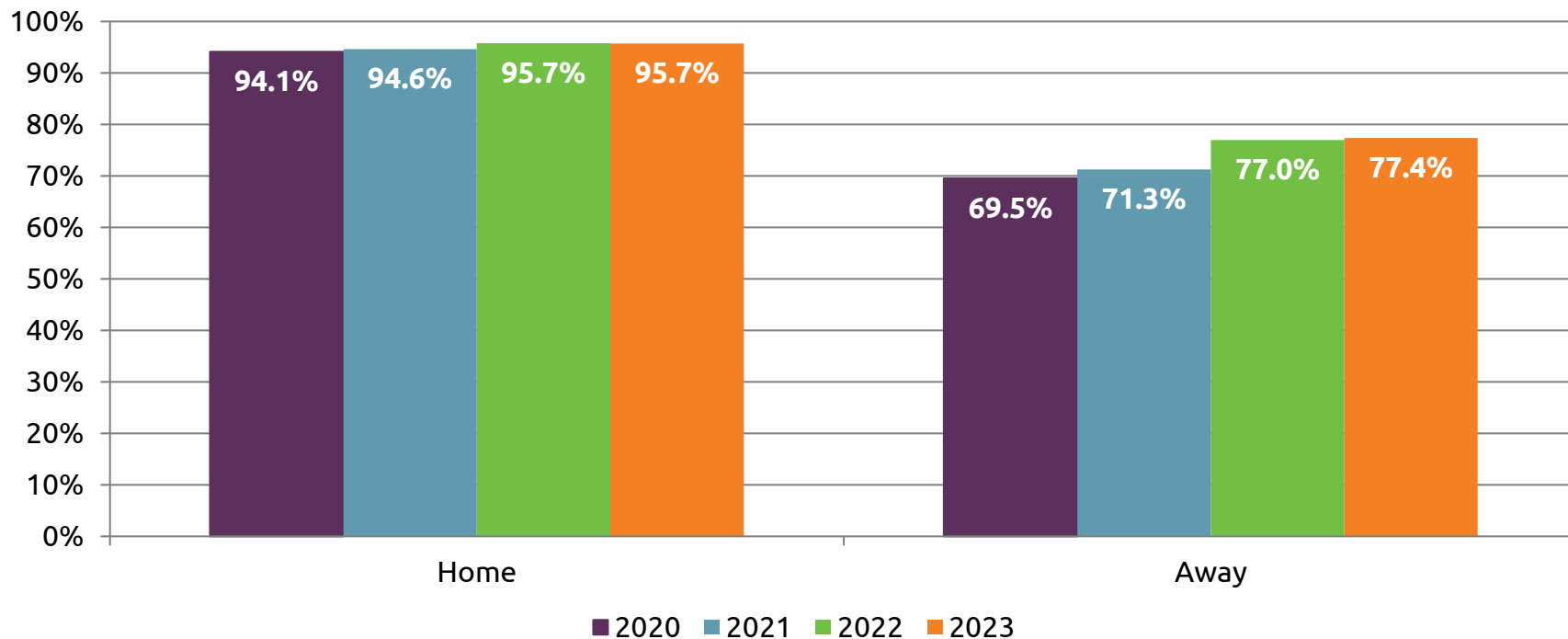

Ranking period

February 1 – February 29, 2024 at 15:00 ET

- ✓ Create your rank order list
- ✓ SUBMIT your rank order list **before the deadline of February 29, 2024 at 15:00 ET**
- ✓ Deadline is **FINAL** and no modifications can be made after the deadline.



Best practices when ranking programs

- Rank in your **preferred** order
- Rank **only programs** where you are willing to match
- **No obligation** to rank a program after an interview
- Any previous conversations with programs regarding mutual interest are **not official, nor binding**
- Listing a residency program on your submitted rank order list establishes a **legal binding commitment to your match result**

Ranking as a couple

- Ranks get considered mutually
- Ability to rank the same program multiple times
- Your match result is tied to that of your partner
- You can retract the couple option **before** the rank order list deadline



Planning a couple's rank order list

1. Rank programs in the same city
2. Rank programs in close proximity
3. Rank programs that are farther apart
4. The **no match** option is available **as a last resort** to allow one member of a couple to match if the other could not

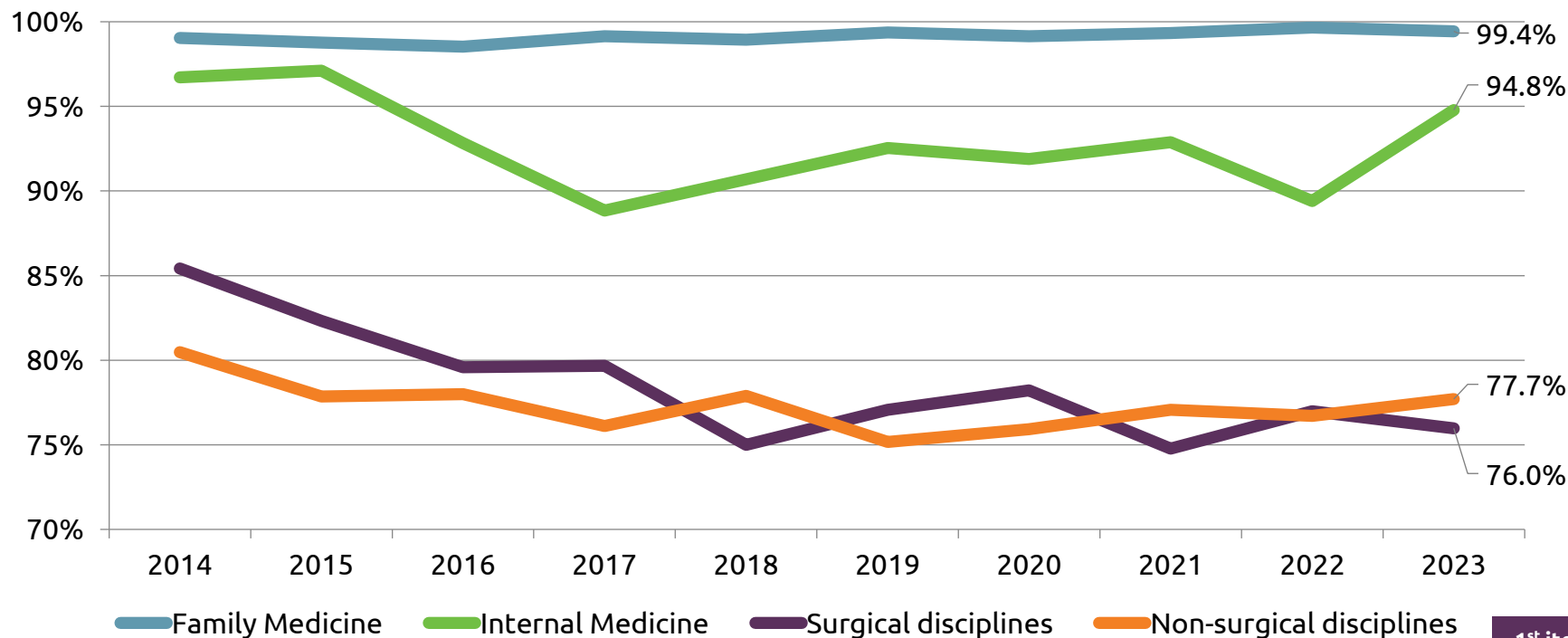

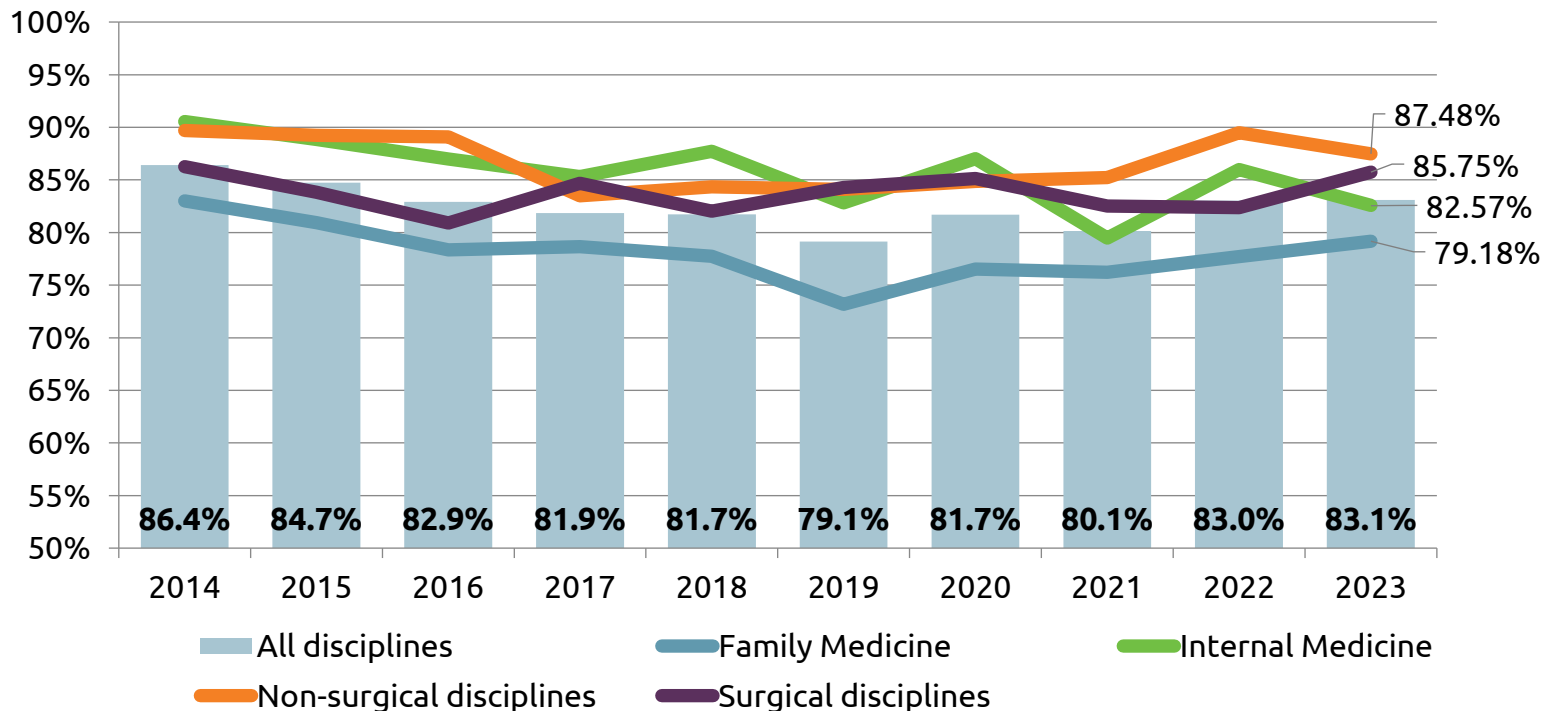
CMGs matched to first choice discipline, by discipline group

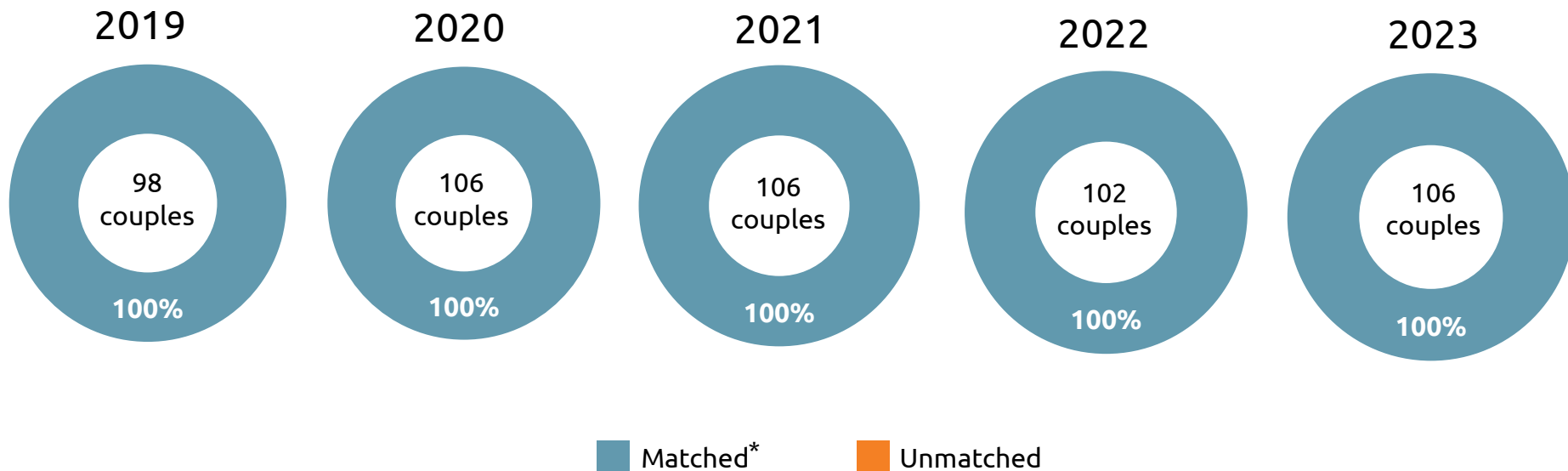


CMGs matched to one of their top three program choices, by discipline group



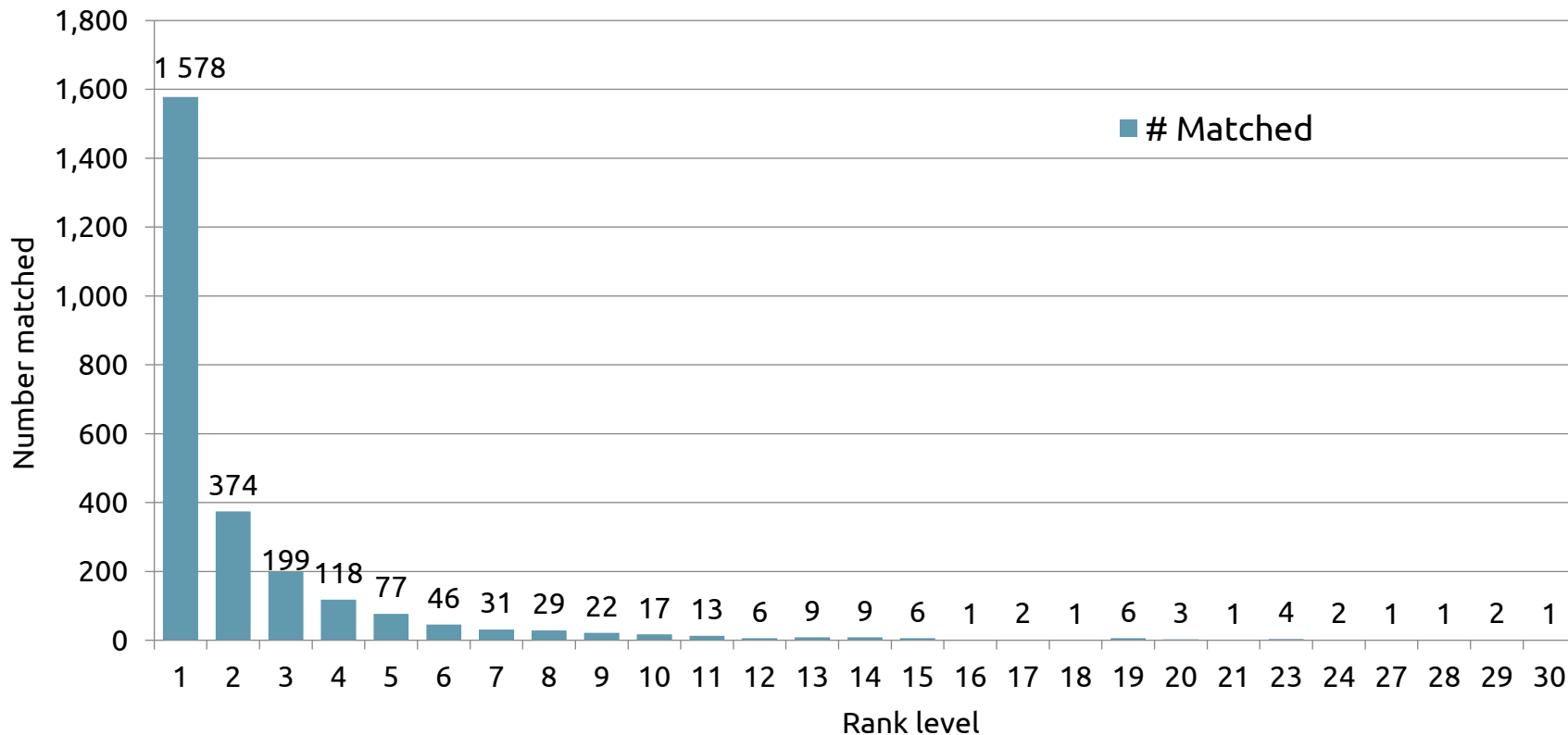

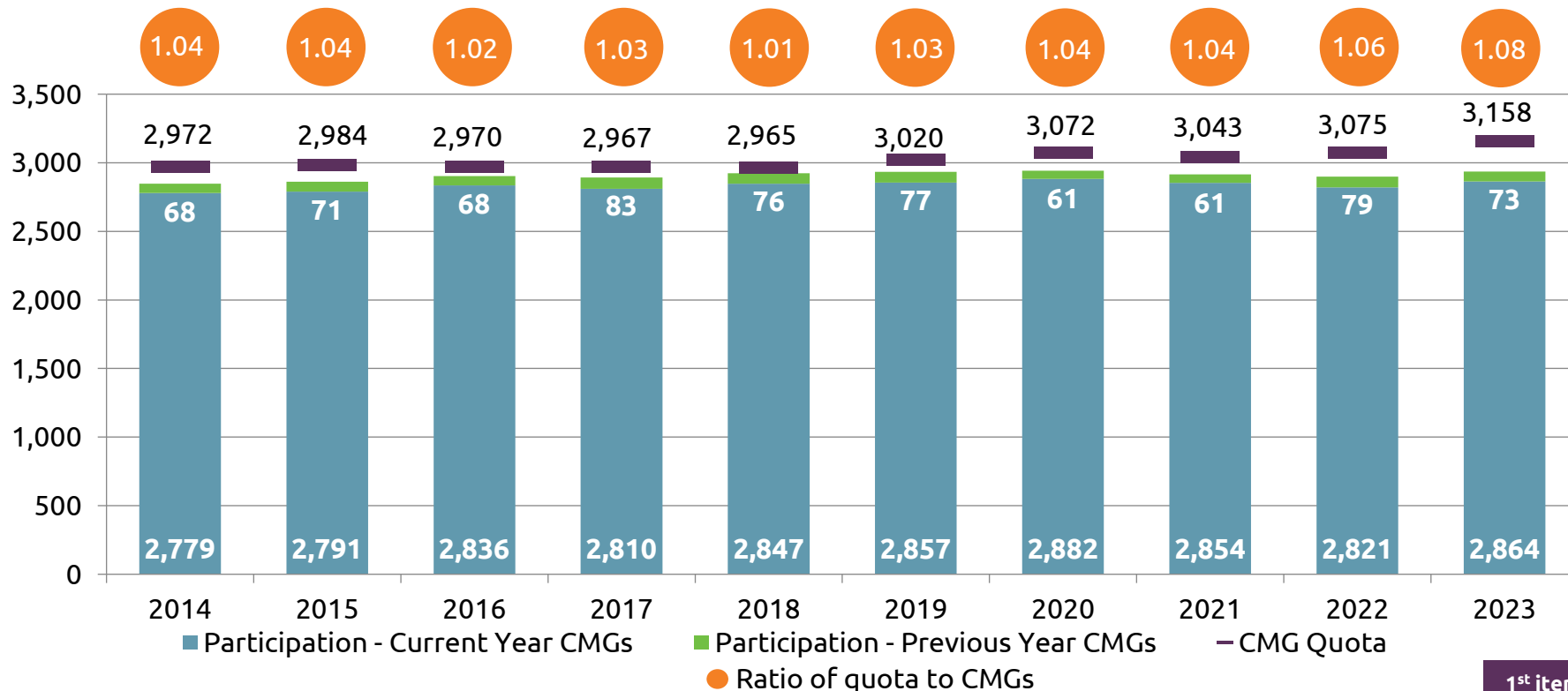

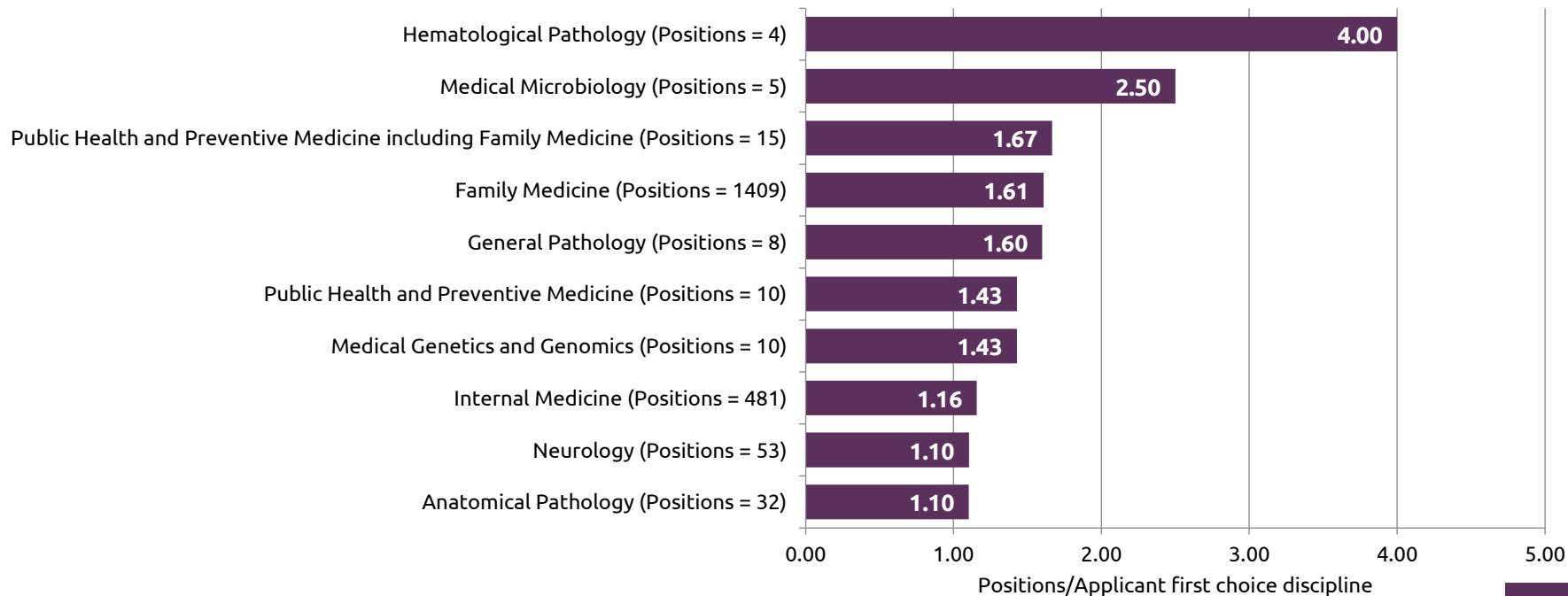
2023 CMG individual matched rank results



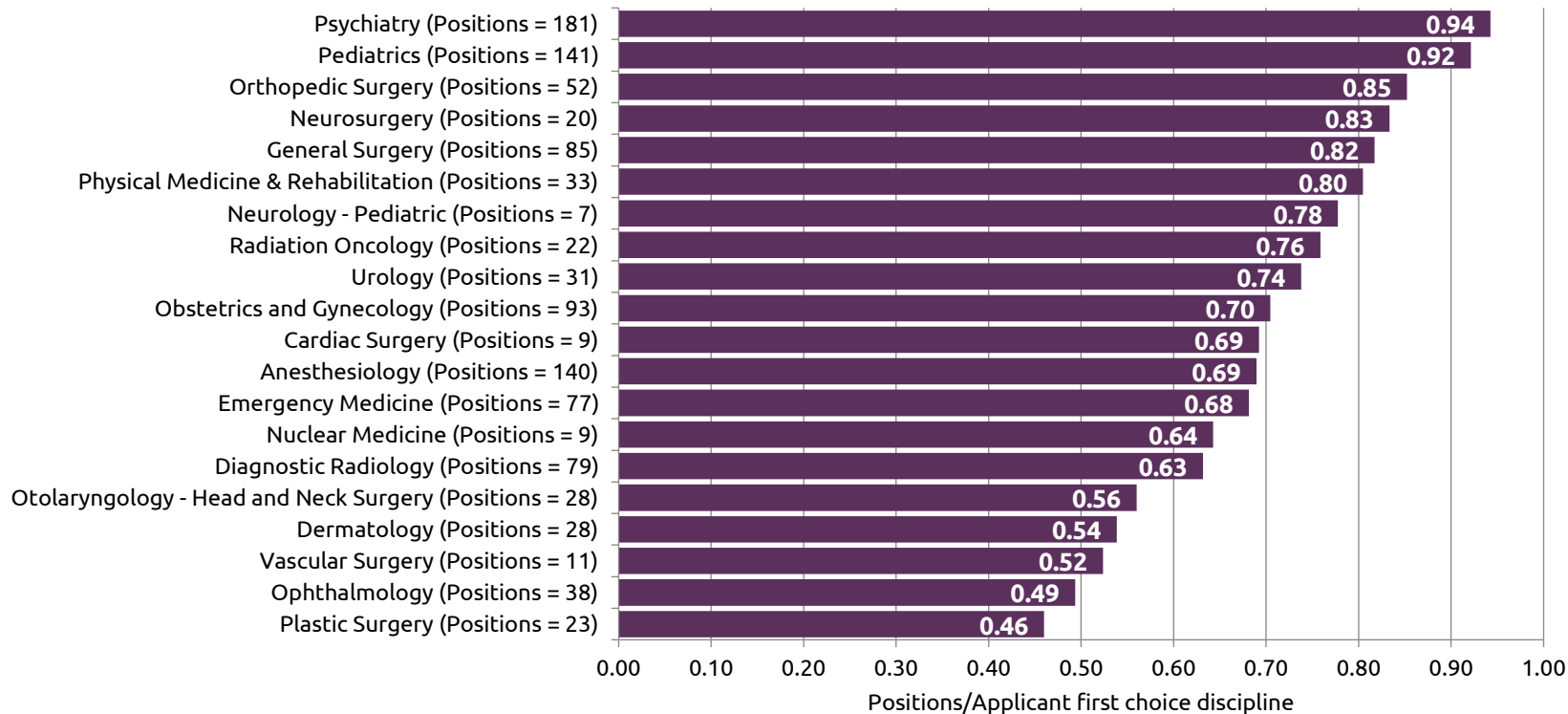
CMG quota, participation and ratio

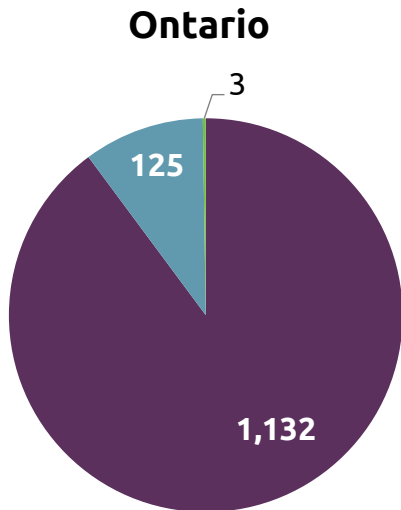

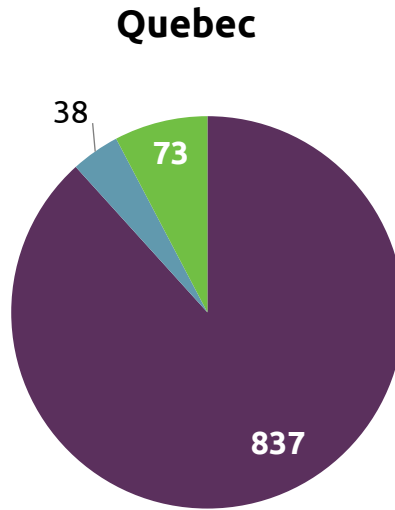
2023 R-1 match regional highlights (program quota view)



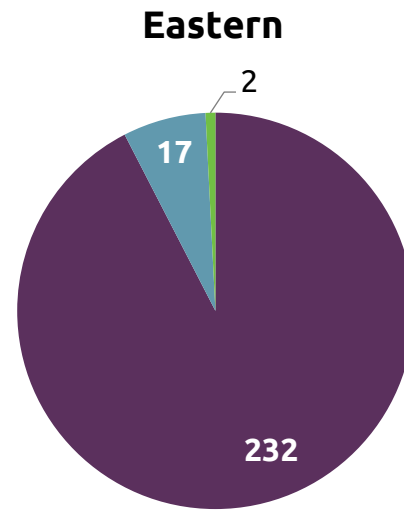

Why might an applicant not match?

1. An applicant was not ranked by a program they ranked
2. An applicant did not rank a program that ranked them
3. An applicant was ranked by a program they ranked, but the program filled all their positions with preferred applicants



Advanced release of unmatched status

- You are able opt in or opt out of sharing your unmatched status with your undergraduate office
- Should you opt in and go unmatched, your status will be shared with your undergraduate office 24 hours before match day
- Undergraduate offices follow their own local practices to support students

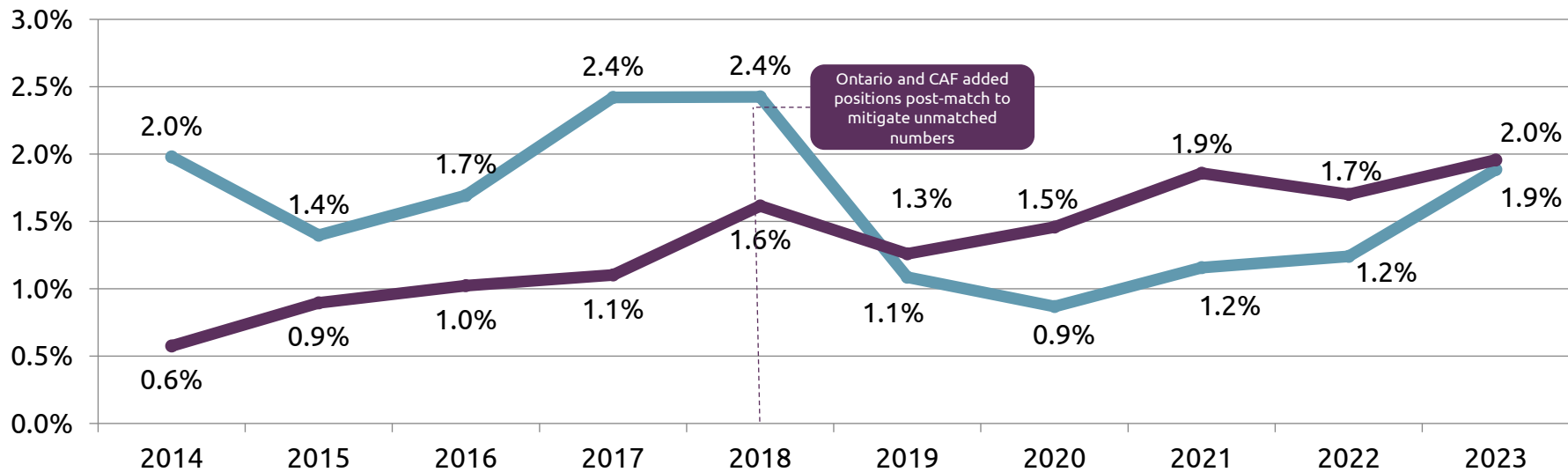
Second iteration



Second iteration: key differences

- March 19 at noon ET – April 25 at noon ET, 2024
- Not all disciplines will be available in the second iteration
- Positions are not available in every location
- Positions can be competitive
 - i.e. IMGs are eligible for the same positions as CMGs in certain provinces
- Current medical residents are eligible to apply

Unmatched current year CMGs after second iteration

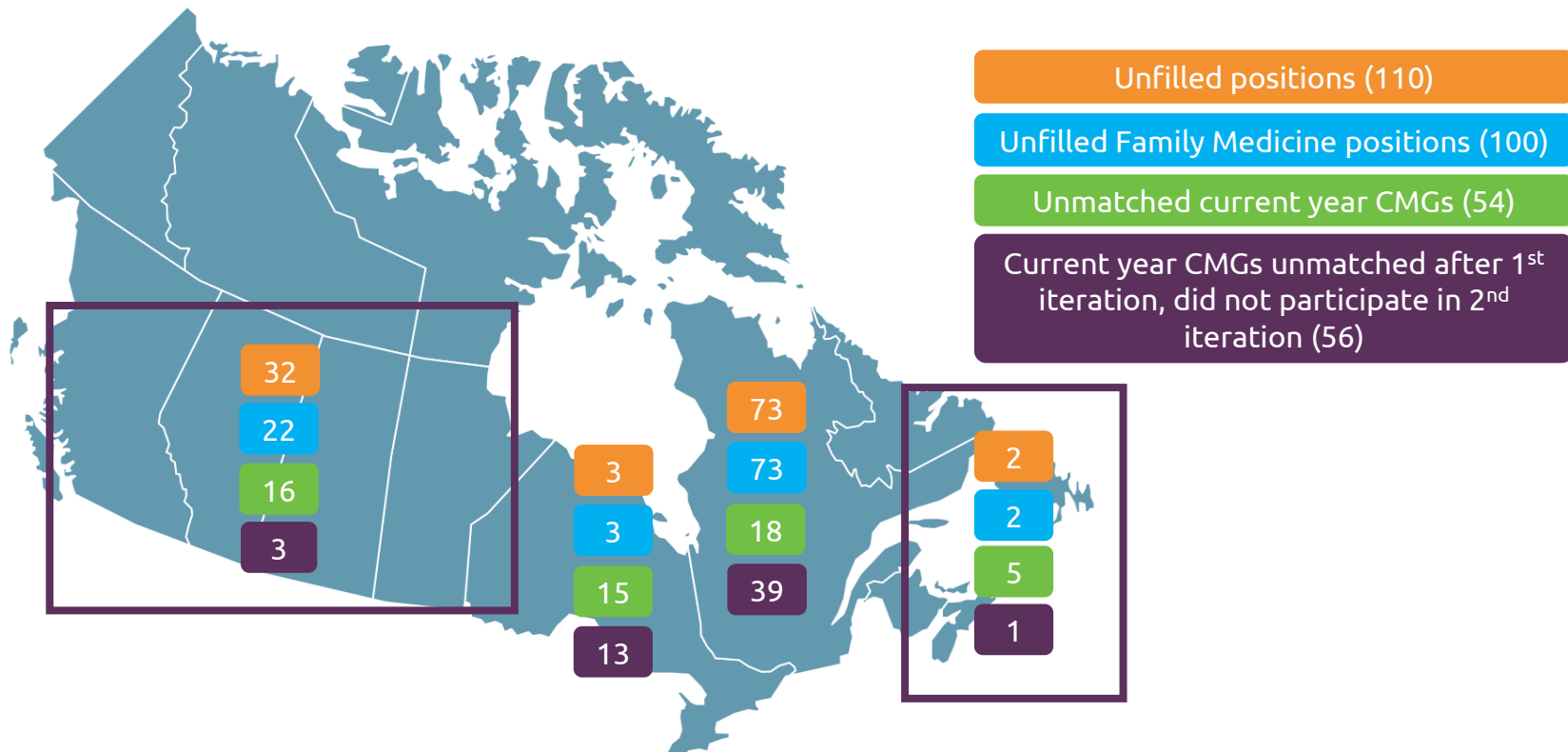

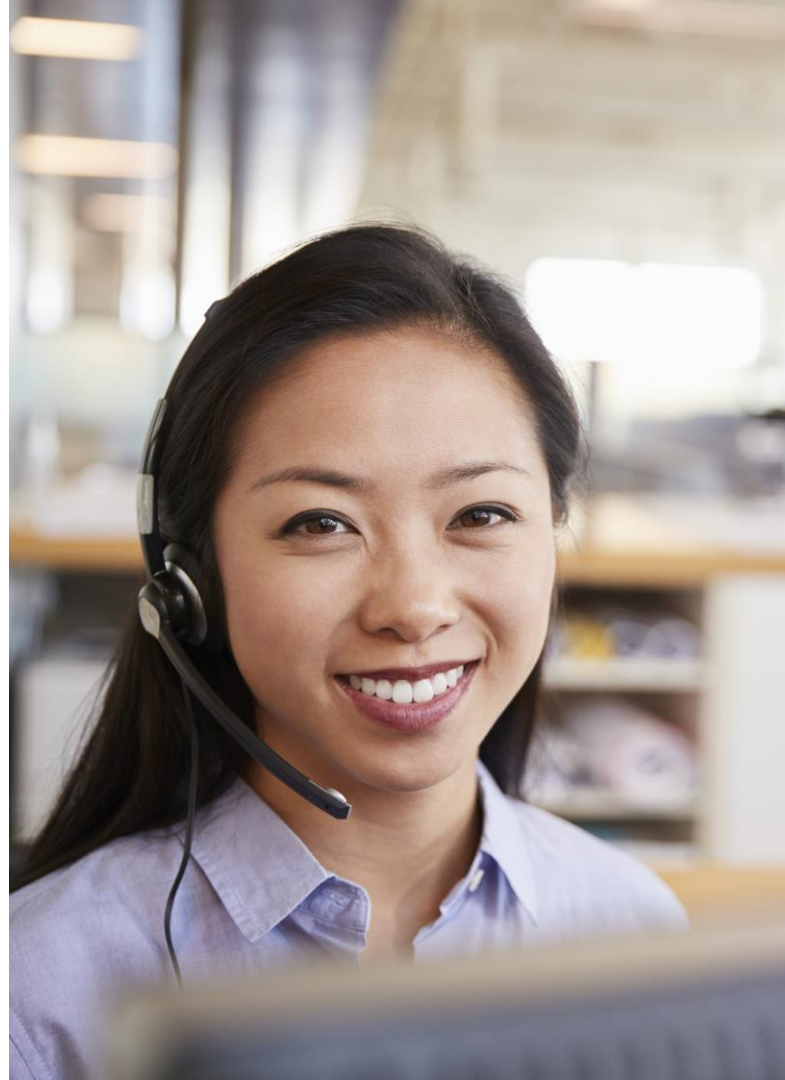
