Métis Talks Spring

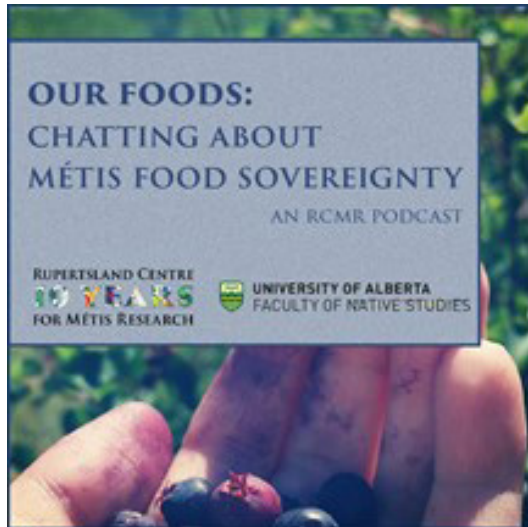

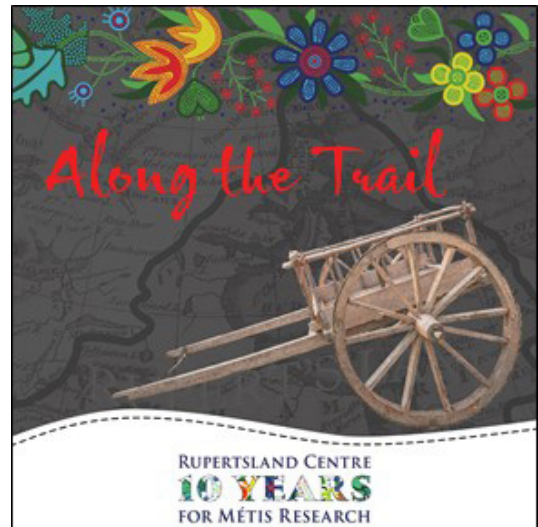
