COLLABORATIVE PROGRAM YEAR ONE

- Elective Course (or ENGL/WRS)
 - Students should enroll in an Elective Course or in ENGL/WRS if not taken in Fall 2023 term.

COLLABORATIVE PROGRAM YEAR TWO - **FAST TRACK:**

- NURS 321 in the Spring Term
- NURS 300 and NURS 327 in the Summer Term

COLLABORATIVE PROGRAM YEAR THREE - **EARLY COMPLETION:**

- NURS 485A+B (Y01/Y02) *or*
- NURS 422 A+B, NURS 425 (Y01/Y02) A+B, INT D 420 A+B

Enroll in whichever course you did NOT complete during Winter 2024, and be sure to enroll, on the same day, in both sections of each course. Section A is in Spring, section B is in Summer -- if you do not enroll in both, and on the same day, Beartracks will drop you from the course.

COLLABORATIVE PROGRAM YEAR FOUR - **FAST TRACK:**

- NURS 485A+B (Y01/Y02) *or*
- NURS 422 A+B, NURS 425 (Y01/Y02) A+B, INT D 420 A+B

Enroll in whichever course you did NOT complete during Winter 2024, and be sure to enroll, on the same day, in both sections of each course. Section A is in Spring, section B is in Summer -- if you do not enroll in both, and on the same day, Beartracks will drop you from the course.

Clinical Placement Locations:

In an effort to support the unique needs of our large student population, the Faculty of Nursing will be trialing a process by which we will share clinical sections and their planned clinical sites/geographical locations two week before registration is scheduled to open. Since the ability to engage in clinical swaps is generally limited after registration opens, the hope is that this new process will allow students the opportunity to select sections that best align with their own unique needs. Please note, that clinical sites are always subject to change and the Faculty of Nursing cannot make any guarantees that the sites shared prior to registration will not change.



Spring/Summer Registration 2024

AFTER DEGREE PROGRAM YEAR ONE

- NURS 205A, *[NURS 432 and 433] or [NURS 437] in Spring
- NURS 205B and NURS 431 in Summer

***NURS 432** (Maternal/Child Nursing Practice) and **NURS 433** (Community Nursing Through the Lifespan) are offered jointly over Spring term. Each course runs for 3 weeks and students will either start with NURS 432 and then take NURS 433 or vice versa.

NURS 432 consists of a perinatal-focused lecture and lab and three clinical days per week. Most students will have their clinical experience in an obstetrical setting and there will be one clinical group each three weeks who will have a child health experience at the Stollery Children's Hospital. Please complete this [Google Form](#) before Friday February 9th, 2024, if you are interested in having a NURS 432 clinical experience in child health. Names will be randomly selected from the list of those completing the Google form and registered in the clinical section assigned to the Stollery Children's Hospital.

After Degree Honors Students: must enroll in Spring Term **NURS 432 LAB D102 in 3W1** and **NURS 433 LAB D201 in 3W2**, and can take any NURS 431 section in Summer Term

AFTER DEGREE PROGRAM YEAR TWO

- NURS 485A+B (Y01/Y02) or
- NURS 422 A+B, NURS 425 A+B (Y01/Y02), INT D 420 A+B

Whichever course(s) you did not take during Winter 2024, you will enroll in for Spring/Summer 2024. Be sure to enroll in both sections of each course on the same day. If you do not enroll in both, on the same day, Beartracks will drop you from the course.

Students selecting INT D 420, NURS 422 and NURS 425 will need to arrange their schedules to ensure appropriate time is set aside for NURS 425 hours with your field mentor. The course dates are **May 6 - August 2**. INT D 420 and NURS 422 classes are scheduled on Fridays. NURS 425 begins with a class block from **May 6-16**, after which students will spend 192 fieldwork hours over the next 11 weeks (an average of 17.5 hours/week). It is important that you keep Monday to Thursday open until you meet with your field mentor and determine which days each week will be spent on fieldwork. Following that you will be able to schedule other outside commitments.

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
