### **Research Partners**

- <u>Strategic advice</u>: Peer mentoring, aligning research proposals with funder requirements, grant laddering, academic content, knowledge mobilization/translation, and research data management.
- Grant-crafting: Group sessions to improve grant genre literacy and grant writing proficiency.
- Grant application development: Proposed research project/program concept assessment, proposal peer review, editorial review, occasional research assistant and graphics support.

### **Research Partners**

- Research team and sponsor relations development:
   Facilitation of networking opportunities between researcher-colleagues and between researchers and funders.
- Grant support coordination: Engagement with relevant and complementary units at the University of Alberta to enhance proposals.




A new associate professor has just started their position. They have limited experience preparing a grant. Where to start?

- Reach out to RP or WCHRI
- 2. Together define a research funding plan focused on seed funding, collaboration
- 3. Connect them with successful applicants
- 4. Review proposal draft
- 5. Guidance through application process

- Responsible for the overall development and coordination of the institution-wide research development support provided by the Research Administration Specialists.
- Works with College/Faculty General Managers to coordinate work with the administrative positions in the Colleges/Faculties and other partner networks.
- Actively engaged in research administrative process and procedure improvement and subsequent implementation across the institution.
- Works with Faculty Research teams to align support and strategies.

## **Research Administration Specialists**

- Offering to be a <u>primary point of contact</u> for all issues related to research administration.
- Provide tactical research administration, navigational, and policy and procedure support to researchers and unit administrators by <u>providing advice</u>, <u>troubleshooting</u> of project and system related issues, etc..
- Develop and deliver research administration related training.

## **Examples of Questions**

- Project closed but we haven't completed the work, how do we extend the project?
- Project closed because it is overextended, what do we do?
- How long is the auto-extension period on my CIHR grant?
- Why hasn't my project been activated yet?
- How do I accept a donation?
- Who should I use as contacts on my application?
- I wasn't able to hire pdf to work on the project, can I hire a technician and still pay them from my grant?

## **Examples of Other Things They Do**

- Administrative project reopenings
- Determine PI eligibility and process exceptions to the Eligibility to Apply for and Hold Research Funding policy
- Complete and Submit Grant Amendment Forms for Tri-agency grants
- Maintain Department and Faculty contact lists for VPRI
- and more to come!
