Vargo Teaching Chair

The Vargo Teaching Chairs are awarded to innovative, excellent teachers, who have shown leadership and mentorship of colleagues. During their tenure, the Vargo Teaching Chairs will be provided with funding to carry out a teaching-related project. The incumbent will have teaching duties throughout the period of the term.

Funds in the amount of \$20,000/annum will be available for approved teaching initiatives. The funds may be used for a variety of purposes and in a combination of ways (e.g., hiring a graduate teaching or research assistant, developing a new teaching technology, travel to conferences, or partial payment of a postdoctoral fellow). No portion may be taken as salary for the applicant. Funds are held by the University of Alberta and spent as outlined in the approved application and in accordance with University of Alberta policies and procedures. The Provost and Vice-President (Academic) may request the return of unspent funds following the completion of the Chair's term.

Eligibility

Any **Continuing** Academic Staff at the University of Alberta from the following categories (as outlined in the <u>UAPPOL Recruitment Policy (Appendix A)</u>) may apply:

- A1(Schedule A Academic Faculty Member; Schedule B Faculty Service Officers (FSO)
 Member; Schedule C Librarian; Schedule F Administrative and Professional Officers (APO)
 Member);
- A2.1 Career, Term 12, Terms Recurring (Schedule D Academic Teaching Staff (ATS) member)

Selection Guidelines

As outlined in the <u>UAPPOL Application and Selection Procedure</u>, the following was considered in the development of the adjudication criteria for the Vargo Teaching Chair:

- Evidence of a career commitment to teaching excellence.
- Evidence of a broad range of teaching at undergraduate and graduate levels in various settings.
- Demonstration of creativity in teaching that enhances learning and engages students.
- Evidence of educational leadership.
- Excellence in mentoring of students and colleagues.
- Innovation in the project or planned activities.

 Impact of the project or planned activities on student learning and alignment with the institutional strategic plan(s)

Vargo Teaching Chairs at the University of Alberta have been created to foster excellence in teaching at the University. This program is committed to supporting individuals who have a history of educational leadership, teaching innovation, and who are committed to enhancing the learning experience of students at all levels.

Application Process

Two-Phase Application Approach

In **Phase 1** of the application process, we invite you to submit an expression of interest. This should introduce yourself to the committee, describe how you engage with the institutional commitments outlined in <u>Braiding Past</u>, <u>Present and Future</u>: <u>University of Alberta's Indigenous Strategic Plan</u> and our <u>institutional commitments to equity, diversity, and inclusivity</u>. Your expression of interest should also highlight your commitment and dedication to excellence in teaching. Those selected to advance to **Phase 2** will be asked to provide a detailed narrative application, including specific evidence that demonstrates your excellence in these areas.

In other words, Phase 1 is about introducing yourself and your story, and Phase 2 is about diving deeper and providing concrete examples and evidence to support that story.

Multi-Modal Application

You are welcome to submit your application in the modality of your choosing (written, audio, video, graphics/animation etc.). The application template is designed to provide guidance on the criteria and specific information that should be included in your submission. Selection Process

The Vargo Teaching Chair Award will be adjudicated by the Awards for Faculty Excellence Adjudication Committee. The Committee requires that no more than one member is absent from any meeting where decisions are made. All proceedings are to remain confidential.
