William Hardy Alexander Award for Excellence in Undergraduate Teaching

The William Hardy Alexander Award for Excellence in Undergraduate Teaching recognizes publicly the achievement of teaching excellence, and is intended to publicize such excellence to the University and the wider community, to encourage the pursuit of achievement of such inclusive excellence among academic staff, and to promote informed discussion of teaching and its improvement at the University of Alberta.

Funds in the amount of \$1500 will be awarded to recipients.

Eligibility

Any Academic Teaching Staff in temporary appointments from the following categories (as outlined in the <u>UAPPOL Recruitment Policy (Appendix A)</u>) may apply:

- A2.2 Term (Schedule D Academic Teaching Staff (ATS) Member (Term));
- A2.3 Full time (Schedule G Temporary Librarian, Administrative and Professional Officer (TLAPS) Member);
- A2.4 Part time (Schedule G Temporary Librarian, Administrative and Professional Officer (TLAPS) Member)

Selection Guidelines

The following was considered in the development of the adjudication criteria for the William Hardy Alexander Award for Excellence in Undergraduate Teaching:

- Evidence of a commitment to teaching excellence as outlined in the <u>Framework for Effective Teaching</u>.
- Demonstration of impact and creativity in teaching that enhances learning and engages students.
- Engagement with the commitments outlined in <u>Braiding Past, Present and Future: University of Alberta's Indigenous Strategic Plan.</u>

Engagement with the <u>institutional commitments to equity, diversity, and inclusivity</u>.

Application Process

Two-Phase Application Approach

In **Phase 1** of the application process, we invite you to submit an expression of interest. This should introduce yourself to the committee, describe how you engage with the institutional commitments outlined in <u>Braiding Past</u>, <u>Present and Future</u>: <u>University of Alberta's Indigenous Strategic Plan</u> and our <u>institutional commitments to equity, diversity, and inclusivity</u>. Your expression of interest should also highlight your commitment and dedication to excellence in teaching. Those selected to advance to **Phase 2** will be asked to provide a detailed narrative application, including specific evidence that demonstrates your excellence in these areas.

In other words, Phase 1 is about introducing yourself and your story, and Phase 2 is about diving deeper and providing concrete examples and evidence to support that story.
