

As part of the attestation process, all those with a named role must confirm they have no active affiliation with, and are not in receipt of funding or in-kind support, from any of the institutions on the <u>Named Research Organizations</u> list.		
No, NSGRP does not apply to NFRF Special Calls. No further action required under the Guidelines.		
For the purposes of STRAC implementation, <u>Tri-agency Institutional Programs Secretariat</u> (TIPS), researchers with named roles in the grant application include the Nominee, Nominated Principal Investigator (NPI); Co-Principal Investigator (Co-PI); Co-Applicant and Collaborator.
