The School of Library and Information Studies and the Digital Humanities Program offer a combined MA in Digital Humanities/MLIS program that students can complete within three years. Students are required to complete a minimum of ± 45 in coursework and a thesis.

Students pursuing the combined degree must take ± 12 in Digital Humanities required courses and ± 6 in Digital Humanities options. They must also take ± 18 in Library and Information Studies required courses and ± 9 in LIS options. The MLIS requirement to complete ± 6 from a list of designated Information Technology courses is fulfilled by content covered in the Digital Humanities courses.

Units of Course Weight (commonly referred to as credits) are represented by the symbol \star here and in the University Calendar.

Students are strongly encouraged to take the required Digital Humanities courses during their first year. Students must also complete a thesis. The student's thesis committee should normally include faculty members from both programs.

A full-time student who is registered for the joint MA/MLIS degree normally will be able to complete the degree requirements in three years.
