SACRED HEART BUILDING APPEAL

Many of you recall that Sacred Heart Church of the First Peoples sustained substantial damage in a fire on August 30, 2020. Thanks be to God, no one was hurt. However, there was major damage to the sanctuary and roof, and the whole building was gutted to remove the wet plaster.

Insurance will cover the cost to replace everything damaged by the fire. The parish has discerned that this is the opportune time to upgrade the heating system, replace the steep front stairs, repair foundation cracks, and improve the worship and gathering space. This will necessitate raising funds in addition to insurance coverage.

Sacred Heart Church is appealing to parishes and interested individuals to contribute to a campaign to raise \$2 million. This will provide the Archdiocese and the Indigenous Catholic community with a sound and beautiful building, in which through worship and fellowship they shall deepen their relationship to God and one another for decades to come.

Sacred Heart Church was designated as a national Indigenous parish in 1991. Now, the First Nations, Metis, and Inuit population of the Edmonton area exceeds 85,000 people. Indigenous people are migrating to urban centres across Canada. Many of them have a Catholic background, so we need to be well situated to foster new relationships with them and the Catholic community, other churches, and the general population.

As Catholics we promote reconciliation at all times, but especially in this moment we yearn to reverse the historic harms that occurred between the Church and the First Peoples of this land. By contributing to this campaign, you are demonstrating solidarity with Indigenous Catholics and commitment to a new beginning full of hope.
