## SHARE LENT 2022

This year Development and Peace-Caritas Canada is resuming its annual campaign instead of being part of Together We Serve. Look forward to more information about his campaign in upcoming bulletins. But for now, here is some basic information about Development and Peace-Caritas Canada:

- It was established in 1967 by the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (after the 2<sup>nd</sup> Vatican Council) to promote alternatives to unjust social, political, and economic structures in the Global South. It is a democratic movement for international solidarity.
- It is the official international development organization of the Canadian Catholic Church, and inspired by Gospel values, in particular the *preferential option for the poor*.
- It supports partners and projects in Africa, Asia, South America, and the Middle East. ALL projects honour the Catholic Social Teachings.
- It works in 5 major areas of intervention: Democracy and Citizen Participation, Peace and Reconciliation, Ecological Justice, Equality between Men and Women, and Humanitarian Aid.
- It educates the Canadian population about causes of impoverishment and mobilizes actions for social change.
- It provides an effective partnership model and ensures that most of the program funding ends up in the hands of the local organizations in the countries helped. They help support local partners and organizations to build capacity within communities and help the most vulnerable become agents of their own development.
- The special collection will be on Solidarity Sunday, April 3<sup>rd</sup>.
