## DEVELOPMENT AND PEACE/CARITAS CANADA

In last week's Bulletin we learned that Canada is currently not meeting its obligations under international human rights norms since we lack effective policies and mechanisms to ensure all Canadian corporations, particularly mining companies, respect human rights and the environment when operating abroad. The lived experiences of D&P partner organizations demonstrate that existing measures are not effective in preventing human and environmental abuses around the world. To prevent human rights abuses and environmental harm before they happen, the obligation for Canadian corporations operating abroad to perform due diligence must be made legally binding. With due diligence legislation, if a company fails to undertake reasonable steps to prevent violations, the victims of harm will have access to remedy and meaningful consequences through Canadian courts.

We are at a crossroads as Canadian parliamentarians are considering another kind of corporate accountability legislation that undermines the goal of compelling companies to adopt due diligence measures and prevent abuses.
