WORLD DAY OF MIGRANTS AND REFUGEES

When we talk about migrants and displaced persons, all too often we stop at statistics. But it is not about statistics, it is about real people, with lives and dreams and families. Please reflect on the following excerpt:

No one must be excluded. God's plan is essentially inclusive and gives priority to those living on the existential peripheries. Among them are many migrants and refugees, displaced persons, and victims of trafficking. The Kingdom of God is to be built with them, for without them it would not be the Kingdom that God wants. The inclusion of those most vulnerable is the necessary condition for full citizenship in God's Kingdom

Building the future with migrants and refugees also means recognizing and valuing how much each of them can contribute to the process of construction ... Openness to one another creates spaces of fruitful exchange between different visions and traditions, and opens minds to new horizons. It also leads to a discovery of the richness present in other religions and forms of spirituality unfamiliar to us, and this helps us to deepen our own convictions.
