In this retreat, we will reflect on the interactions between Peter and Jesus, noting how their relationship develops over time. Jesus rescues Peter from himself! Drawing on the teachings of Thomas Merton, Jesus appears to be in the process of awakening Simon Peter to awareness of his "false self" - his facade of defenses and pretenses - and calling forth his "truth" - the inner rock upon which he stands in all honesty before God and others.
