DEVELOPMENT & PEACE

Pope Francis has stated that "The native Amazonian peoples have probably never been so threatened on their own lands as they are now." In our Fall Action "For Our Common Home" D&P is highlighting two traditional communities of the Amazon in Brazil under threat. The way of life of Machadinho d'Oeste's seringueiros (artisanal rubber tappers) is being destroyed by industrial logging. The Mura Indigenous people of Manaus were not consulted before a phosphate mining company began operations on their lands.

Sign the D&P-Caritas Canada Solidarity Letter next weekend after mass to support these two communities. Your signatures will allow us to call for their protection and respect of their rights. ARCHBISHOP SMITH ON D&P

Given the controversy regarding the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) and Development and Peace, it may be of interest to note that Archbishop Smith wrote in support of this year's Fall Action. He writes:

This year's campaign theme, For our Common Home, is inspired by Pope Francis' encyclical Laudato Si – On Care for our Common Home. The first part of this campaign has been dedicated to the Amazon in recognition of the essential role that this biome plays for humanity. It also reflects the concerns that led Pope Francis to convene a Special Assembly of the Synod of Bishops for the Pan-Amazon Region at the Vatican during the month of October.

By this letter, I would like to encourage you to engage in the actions suggested, such as making an intergenerational pledge and writing letters to the defenders of the Amazon. I am pleased to support these educational initiatives.

The Archdiocese has given a brief statement to the producers regarding such publication, explaining that that issue is still under study in this Archdiocese.
