BACHELOR OF THEOLOGICAL STUDIES IN DIACONAL MINISTRY ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Diploma in Diaconal Ministries from Centre for Christian Studies or current enrollment in that program 1.
- 2. General readiness to function in an integrative adult learning program in terms of both personal qualities and academic competencies
- 3. Commitment to one's lay profession or employment (paid or volunteer) as a ministry
- Willingness to engage in a program that is grounded in the Christian faith but is also broadly ecumenical and 4. multifaith
- 5. Language Requirements: All applicants must be proficient in English prior to admission. Proficiency is demonstrated by either (a) possession of a prior diploma or degree where the primary language of instruction was English, (b) demonstration of sufficient coursework completed in English, or (c) a satisfactory score on an approved English language examination (either TOEFL iBT, IELTS, CAEL, or PTE Academic). Application deadline: CCS students must apply to the program no later than after they have taken three open studies courses at St. Stephen's College. CCS graduates must apply within 5 years of completing the CCS Diploma in Diaconal Ministries; applications will be assessed on the basis of previous academic work, including the CCS Diploma and any additional academic courses and professional training.

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

90 Credits

Students must complete all requirements within seven years. Extensions are considered in exceptional circumstances [see Program Extension policy].

12 Theme Learning Circles, Diaconal Praxis Years, Global Perspectives Experience, 3 Integrating Circles 8 courses: Intro Christian Scriptures, Christian Scriptures: Theme/Focus, Intro Hebrew Scriptures, Hebrew Scriptures: Theme/Focus, Intro Theology, Theology: Theme/Focus, Church History, Intro Ethics.

(Six of these courses [18 credits] must be taken at St. Stephen's College)

POST CCS WORK:

Integrative Theology Paper (6 credits): 40-60 pages, at the undergraduate level. A project of guided research founded upon personal reflection and integration designed to demonstrate the researcher's ability to correlate learning from a variety of disciplines and integrate theological and personal meaning within a ministry setting.

MASTER OF THEOLOGICAL STUDIES IN DIACONAL MINISTRY ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Baccalaureate Degree from an institution of higher education approved by a Canadian provincial authority, or the demonstrated educational equivalent. Grade average minimum must be 72%/B/3.0 during last 60 credits of course weight.
- 2. Diploma in Diaconal Ministries from CCS, or current enrollment in that program
- 3. General readiness to function in an integrative adult learning program in terms of both personal qualities and academic competencies
- 4. Commitment to one's lay profession or employment (paid or volunteer) as a ministry
- 5. Willingness to engage in a program that is grounded in the Christian faith but is also broadly ecumenical and multifaith
- 6. Language Requirements: All applicants must be proficient in English prior to admission. APPLICATION PROCEDURE

All documents submitted in support of this application become the property of St. Stephen's College and are not returnable to the applicant or transferable to any third party. All materials will be kept strictly confidential. All materials must be received in order for your application to be considered complete. Prospective students should submit the following documentation:

- 1. The attached application form.
- 2. The non-refundable application fee.
- 3. Official CCS transcript (mailed directly to the College). If no CCS coursework has been completed at time of application to SSC, proof of CCS enrollment to be emailed from CCS to SSC at st.stephens@ualberta.ca.
- 4. Official transcript of Baccalaureate Degree (mailed directly to the College) if applying to MTS.
- 5. Curriculum vitae in summary form. This document should include:
 - · Professional experience: Position, place, and duration
 - Post-secondary education: Degrees, diplomas and certificates held, with institutions and dates
 - Other experience, education or training related to proposed program
- 6. Two letters of reference sent directly to College (using Reference Form which is part of the application).
 - (a) one letter should be from a member of the leadership team in the applicant's volunteer or professional setting
 - (b) include one academic referee if within 3 years of graduating, or if still enrolled at CCS

Referees are to indicate the length and nature of their relationship to the applicant, and comment on the following points, as possible:

- Character, personality, and capacity for personal growth and development
- Academic ability
- Capacity for work in an educational model that emphasizes reflection on experience and personal growth as well as knowledge and skill development
- Emotional stability
- Leadership and vocational qualities
- · General readiness for pursuing their goals by means of the proposed course of study

Application Deadline: Applications are submitted to the Registrar's Office at any time; it is recommended that applicants apply within 5 years of completing CCS Diploma. Students will be part of the following intake July 1, with first Program Fee payment due July 31.

EQUIVALENCIES PROCEDURE

An application to the MTS from persons who do not possess a Baccalaureate Degree will be considered if the applicant possesses satisfactory alternate educational experience. In such cases, the Dean will require evidence of readiness to proceed. The Dean's decision whether or not to accept an application is final.

Prospective applications for whom special consideration is required should submit all supporting documentation (see Admission Requirements), together with any additional assessments, transcripts, and certificates earned in lieu of a related Baccalaureate Degree. A non-refundable equivalency fee of \$225 must be included. The Dean's Office will review all documentation, and where it is deemed further exploration is warranted, may assign additional requirements to test eligibility. If equivalency is granted, the applicant will be invited to pay the non-refundable regular application fee.
