Rebecca is an activist and scholar, specializing in Indigenous Peoples Education and her research focuses on Indigenous knowledge and knowledge mobilization, Aboriginal healing through language and culture, anti-racism and decolonization. In 2013, she received, together with her Indigenous colleagues, the UofA Human Rights Teaching Award for her role in coordinating and teaching Alberta's first compulsory course in Aboriginal Education.
