Salary will be commensurate with experience and qualifications in accordance with the Collective Agreement.

WGS 298 should introduce students from a wide range of backgrounds (with no prerequisites) to some core concept or idea of the field. We are especially interested in

course proposals that add to our existing offerings, appeal to a wide group of students, and show a commitment to intersectional feminist analysis, critical race, Indigenous, and/or global feminist studies.
