The devastating impacts of COVID-19 in many minority and immigrant communities, along with the worldwide support given to Black Lives Matter demonstrations protesting the murder of George Floyd by Minneapolis police have drawn renewed attention to racism and the desirability of anti-racism. In this talk, Yasmeen Abu-Laban reflects on the Canadian situation, demographic trends, and policy responses, especially as they pertain to higher education. She also draws on the general research as well as surveys she has been involved with dealing with the profession of political science in Canada and internationally, to consider good practices for ensuring inclusion and more equitable outcomes in organizations and professions. Such good practices can begin to provide clues for identifying "anti-racist praxis."
