CALL FOR APPLICATIONS**CHILD & ADOLESCENT PSYCHIATRY SUBSPECIALTY RESIDENCY PROGRAM**

The Division of Child and Adolescent psychiatry at the University of Alberta offers a Royal College accredited Child and Adolescent Psychiatry Subspecialty (CAPS) program. Our program is designed to be 24 months long. CAP subspecialty training is designed to be approximately 24 months long. Residents generally start the program once they have completed the Core Stage of Canadian Psychiatric Residency. Along with all the other CAP subspecialty programs in Canada, we use the Competence By Design (CBD) framework.

Residents are encouraged to apply in their PGY4 year. Applications from PGY-5 residents may also be considered, but candidates are encouraged to contact the Program Director ahead of time to discuss this possibility. This may extend the length of training to beyond 6 total years.

We are a close-knit program that offers three positions per year. We provide a wealth of excellent learning opportunities for becoming clinical and academic child and adolescent psychiatrists, and we work with each resident individually to support them in identifying and preparing for specific career interests within the field.

Our rotations are designed to help you achieve your Entrustable Professional Activities (EPAs). This starts with a Transition to Discipline rotation that links in to the start of your Foundations rotation set in the Emergency Department and Urgent Clinic of the Stollery Children's Hospital and a community clinic. You will have close staff supervision as you get to know the program. There are a variety of clinics and day hospital programs to choose from to complete the Foundations stage, both through Alberta Health Services and CASA Child, Adolescent & Family Mental Health.

Core stage includes rotations in:

- Consultation Liaison Psychiatry (at the Stollery)
- Eating Disorders (University of Alberta Hospital)
- Forensics (Alberta Hospital Edmonton)
- Infant-Preschool Psychiatry (ElmTree Clinic)
- a Rural setting (rotation in Yukon or rural Alberta or through a longitudinal suburban clinic rotation)
- Residential Inpatients (CASA House)
- Acute Care Inpatients (Royal Alexandra Hospital)

Additional longitudinal experiences including family therapy, individual psychotherapy, a continuity clinic, a scholarly project & graduated exposure to on-call experiences are part of rounding out your clinical experience and complement the exposures you get on your horizontal rotations.

The end of training is devoted to your Transition to Practice and includes time for electives designed to allow you to consolidate the skills you have gained in managing a clinical service, teaching and preparing for lifelong learning.

Our formal academic curriculum includes seminar series in family therapy, individual psychotherapy, psychopharmacology, developmental psychopathology, normal development and our newly launched WIDER LENS curriculum (Wellness; Integration of Work & Life; Difficult Discussions & Dispute Resolution; Equity, Diversity, Inclusion; antiRacism; Leadership; Ethics; New starts & transition to practice; Systems & organizations). In addition to scheduled academic days, residents also have protected time to attend local Grand Rounds & the National Seminar Series.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA AND APPLICATION PROCESS

CHILD & ADOLESCENT PSYCHIATRY SUBSPECIALTY RESIDENCY PROGRAM

Eligibility Criteria

The following eligibility criteria must be met for applications to be considered:

A. Applicants in a Psychiatry Residency Program:

1. Applicants are currently in PGY4 of a Psychiatry Residency Program at a Canadian university.
2. Applicants are in good standing in their current Psychiatry Residency Program.
3. Applicants are eligible for an educational license from the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Alberta.
4. Applicants must complete the Core of Discipline EPAs for General Psychiatry in order to start in the CAPS training program.
5. Applications from PGY-5 residents may also be considered, but candidates are encouraged to contact the Program Director ahead of time to discuss this possibility. This may extend the length of training to beyond 6 total years.

B. Applicants who will be certified as a Psychiatrist by the Royal College before starting the CAPS Program:

1. Applicants must demonstrate that they were in good standing at the completion of their general psychiatry program.
2. Applicants are eligible for an educational license from the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Alberta.

Application Instructions

In keeping with the 16 CAPS programs across the country, our application process includes the following:

1. Completed and signed application form
2. Letter of Good Standing from your Psychiatry residency Program Director
3. Updated CV: areas to cover should include, but are not limited to, educational background, scholarly activities, and other accomplishments
4. Personal statement (suggested maximum of 750 words): areas to cover should include, but are not limited to, your interest in the subspecialty, your interest in the U of A program specifically, your suitability as an applicant, and your possible career goals
5. 3 reference letters: letters should comment on your suitability to enter the subspecialty, as well as your competency in each of the Royal College CanMEDS roles (Medical Expert, Communicator, Collaborator, Leader, Health Advocate, Scholar, and Professional); at least one

letter from a practice Child & Adolescent Psychiatrist preferred; Please address to Dr. Lindy VanRiper and the University of Alberta CAPS Selection Subcommittee.

Application Deadline: Tuesday, September 3rd, 2024 - all components of application package must be sent to capadmin@ualberta.ca by this date

Selection Process

1. Following a review of all application packages by the Program Director and/or Selection Committee, suitable candidates will be invited for virtual interviews.
2. Candidates will be contacted no later than September 23, 2024 to set up the virtual interviews.
3. Our main interview dates will be **October 2 & 3** depending on availability of Selection Committee members, but our Program will attempt to be flexible if a candidate is unable to be available at the offered interview time.
4. The interview process is as follows:
 - a. Interviews will be conducted by the Program Director, PGY6 residents and members of the Selection Subcommittee via Zoom.
 - b. All candidates will be asked the same predetermined interview questions.
 - c. The Selection Committee will use a standardized method to rate responses to the interview questions.
5. The Selection Committee will review the application package and interview results of each of the candidates and rank them accordingly.
6. First offers of acceptance in the CAPS RP will be sent to each successful candidate **on Thursday, October 24, 2024 at 14:00 EST (12:00 MT)**, in keeping with the nationally determined CAP COPE dates.
7. Each successful candidate must respond to the Letter of Offer **no later than 12:00 noon EST (10am MT) on Tuesday, October 29, 2024**, in keeping with the nationally determined CAP COPE dates.
